

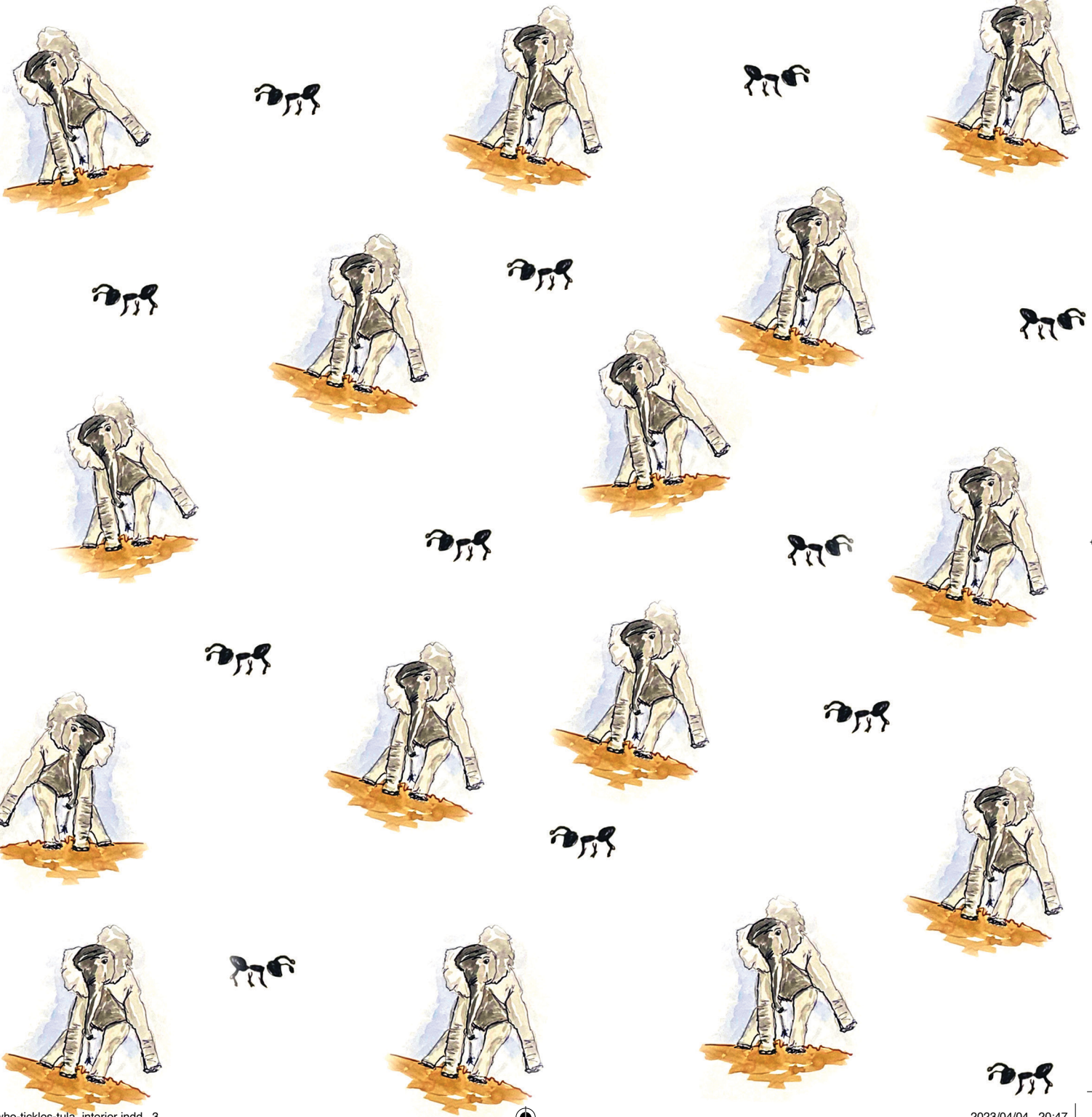

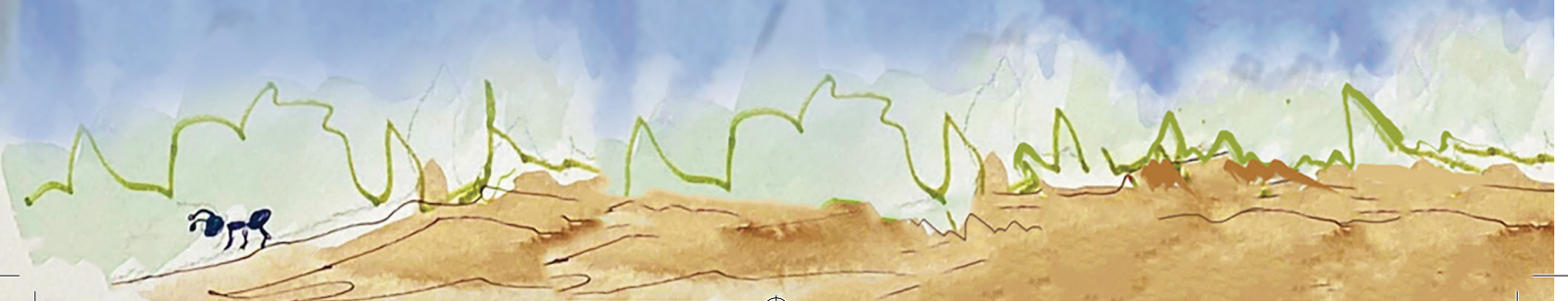


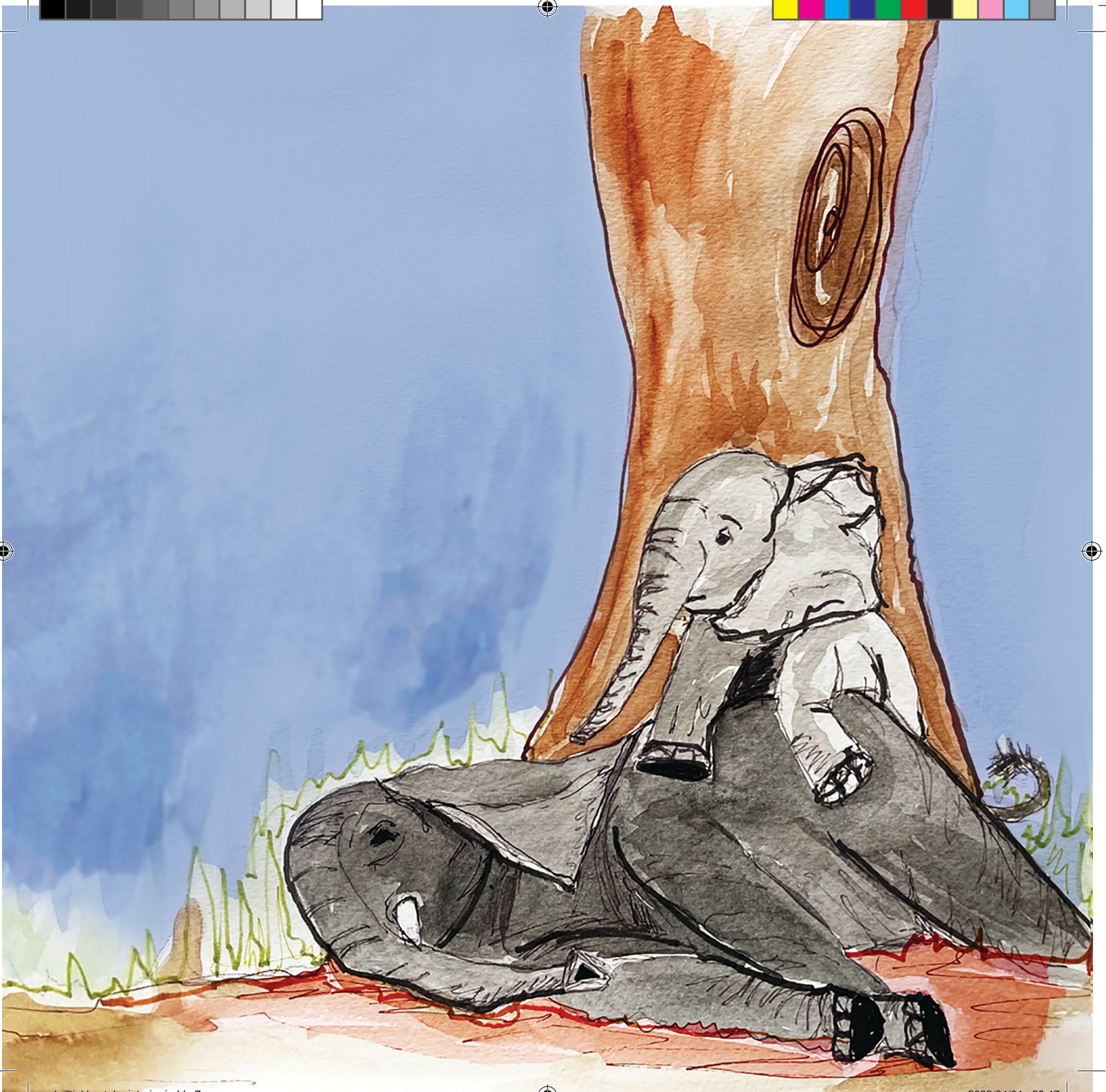

But Tula is not tired.



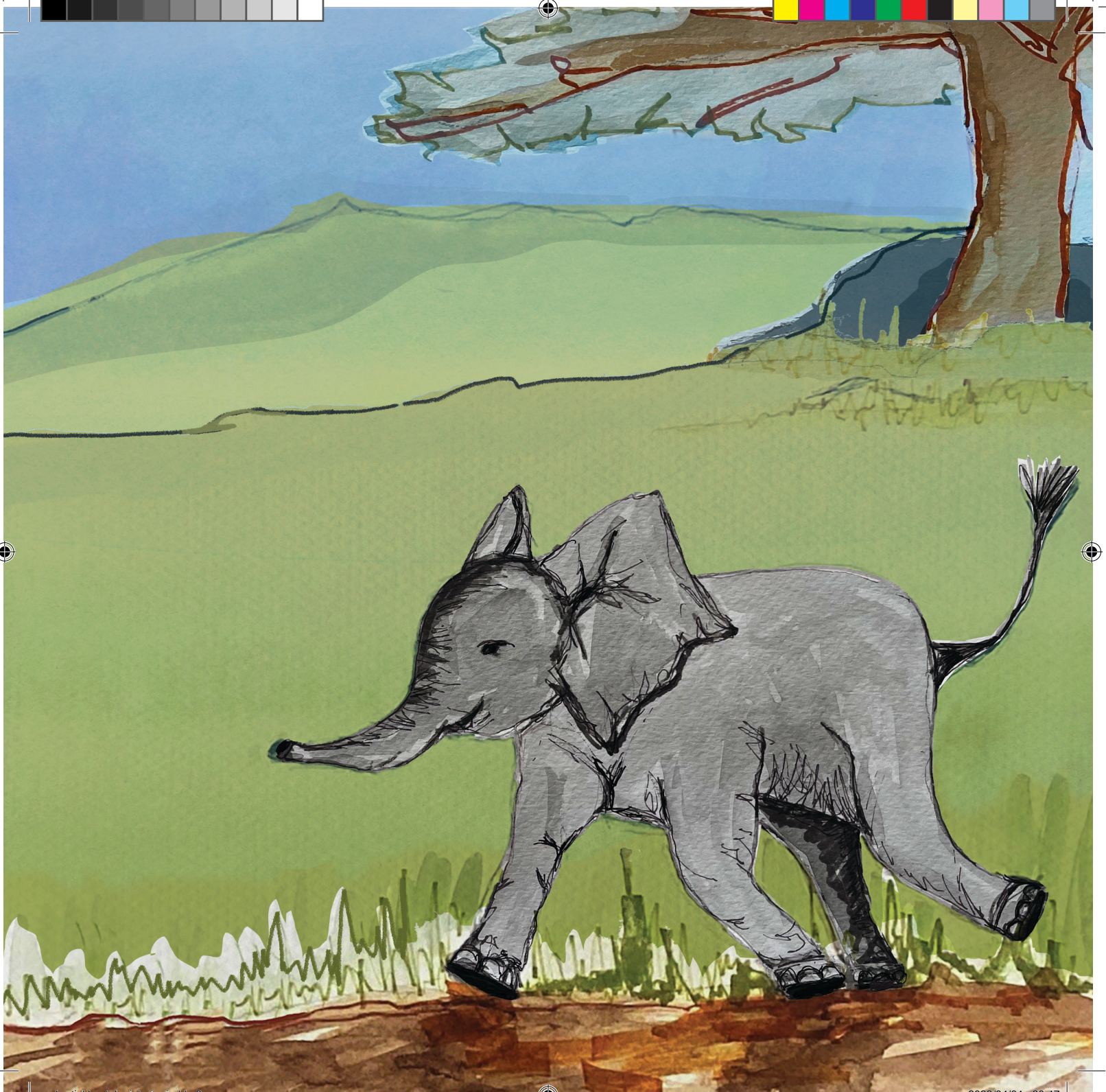




Tula takes a walk.  
She sees a little sand hill.









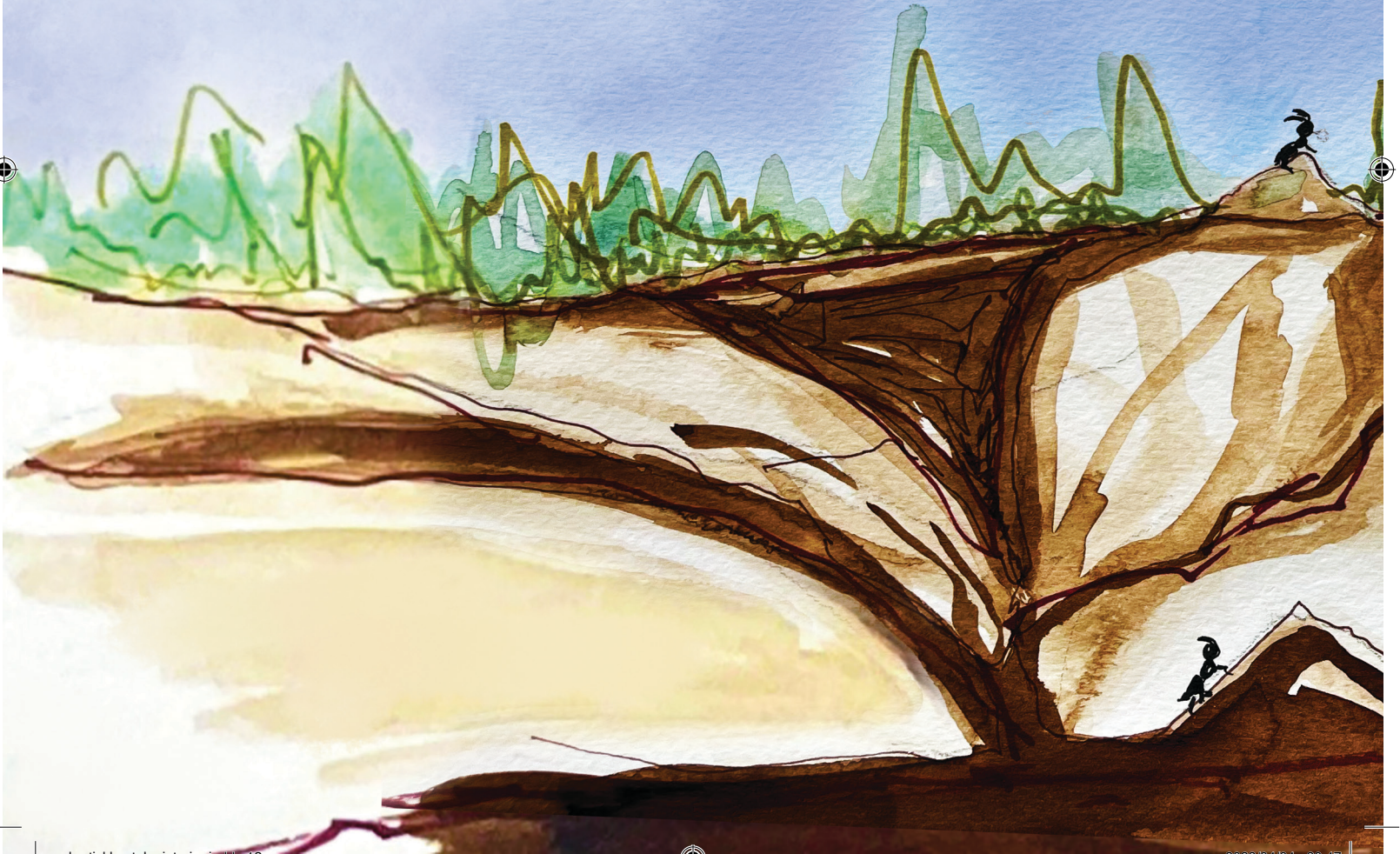
“That’s strange...

crawls up Tula’s trunk.**



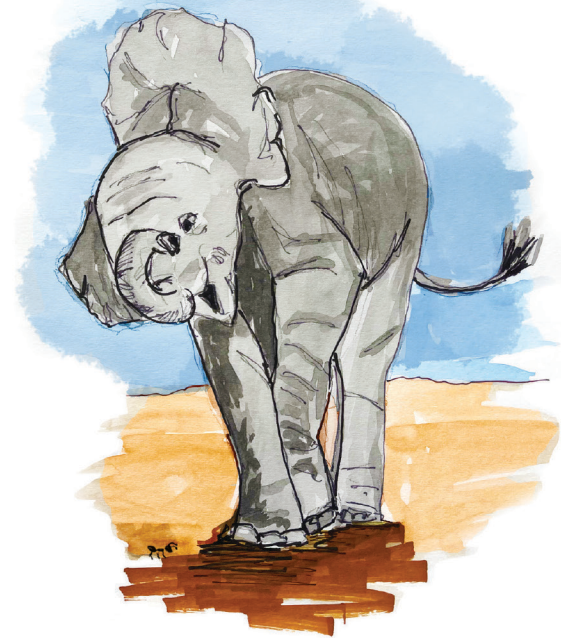
