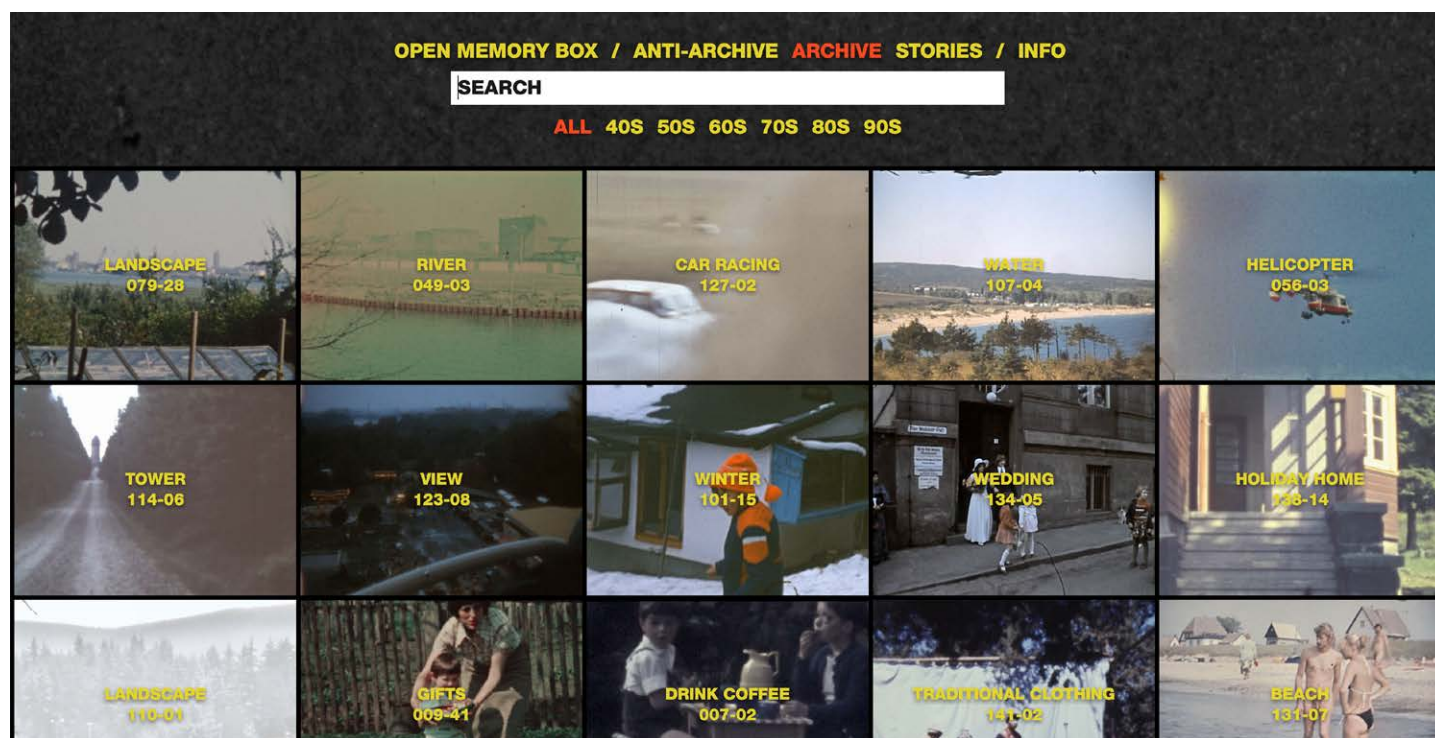
FROM A BYGONE ERA

Watch at least six of the films on your topic together and exchange ideas using the following key questions:

- What are your immediate emotional reactions to the films?
- What differences between past and present do you notice?
- Can you tell whether the short video was shot in a capitalist or socialist country?
- What in the videos seemed like it was very typically German?
What would have been different if the videos had been filmed in the U.S.?
- How do the people look? In what situations do they find themselves?
- What are the similarities between the videos?
