

Onleihe eLibrary explained for foreign publishers

The Goethe-Institut maintains reference libraries worldwide. Since 2011, the Goethe-Institut has also offered loans of e-books. So far, e-books can be borrowed there mainly in German, but the Goethe-Institut would also like to offer users translations of German books in the local language.

To lend e-books and other electronic media, the Goethe-Institut uses the Onleihe eLibrary.

Onleihe is commercially distributed by divibib GmbH, a subsidiary of the ekz group. It is a lending system for electronic media that is used in Germany and in several other countries almost exclusively by many public libraries.

The use and circulation system works as follows:

1. Purchase of titles and provision through divibib
 - a. The divibib contracts with the licensing publisher for the use of the e-book programme.
For each use license re-sold by divibib, the publisher receives compensation on a quarterly basis.
 - b. The licensing publisher provides divibib with an unprotected PDF of the e-book and EPUB data.
 - c. Divibib furnishes the e-book with DRM protection and adds it to their media shop.
 - d. The libraries, as customers of divibib, can acquire one or multiple licenses of e-books in their online lending platform. For each license of e-books they pay a fee to divibib, which in turn settles with the licensing publisher (as described in 1a). The number of licenses for an e-book title that a library purchases specifies how many users this library can lend this title to and therefore how many can read it simultaneously. Each library can purchase as many licenses for your e-book title as it requires.

2. Borrowing by library users
 - a. Nature and duration of use
When a library has purchased a license for their online lending platform, it can be borrowed by authorized library users and can be used on a PC or a mobile device. The loan period for e-books is usually two weeks; after the loan period, the e-book becomes unusable.
 - b. The eLibrary in public libraries
To borrow a title, a user must be registered with the respective library. Only residents registered in the respective city can register with a public library in Germany.
 - c. The Goethe-Institut eLibrary
As a rule, only persons who are residents of the country can register as users of the Goethe-Institut eLibrary.

The Goethe-Institut eLibrary is accessible to all users of the Goethe-Instituts abroad. If the Goethe-Institut has acquired, for instance, three licenses to use an e-book on its online lending platform, the e-book can be borrowed in all countries where the Goethe-Institut offers the eLibrary (see the Goethe-Institut [website](#)), but always only by three users simultaneously worldwide.
