

Catch up with Cine Europa Fever in FDCP's Cinematheque in Iloilo

ILOILO CITY, Philippines (As released) — Ilonggos have until 29 October to catch up with the Cine Europa fever at the Film Development Council of the Philippines' Cinematheque in Iloilo City.

For the fifth time, FDCP is hosting the film festival in Iloilo City whose public screenings started on 24 October with the film "Sult" (Hunger) from Denmark.

Contemporary and classical films from Austria, Czech Republic, France, Denmark, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Norway, Romania, Slovakia, Sweden and United Kingdom are being screened in the Cinematheque.


Mattias Lentz, Minister Counsellor of the EU Delegation to the Philippines, is joined by British Ambassador Daniel Robert Pruce and officials of the Film Development Council of the Philippines in Iloilo City in showcasing Cine Europa on October 27. The featured film that day is "A Moving Image" from the United Kingdom.

"A Moving Image" is the story about Nina, a young stifled artist, who returns to her community after a long absence and is soon painted as a symbol of gentrification. As she struggles with her own complicity, she begins to create a piece of art that can bring her community together.

Lentz said that the EU Delegation to the Philippines and the EU Member States' Embassies and Cultural Institutes are happy that Cine Europa is again screening in lloilo, considering the high regard of the llonggos for their cultural heritage.
