- Subject : Custom-made Circuit Reading Classes
 - Contents : Presentation of the examples of 'Custom-made Circuit Reading Classes', implementation is coordinated by Samcheok Lifelong Education Information Center. The program is for 4th-grade-children from 11 elementary schools. It is being conducted by librarians and instructors who visit remote and excluded mountain areas once a month for six months. The purpose of the program is to narrow the gap of children's reading culture between communities as well as to activate the school libraries.

Lee Seung-Gil

- Subject : How student's learning attitudes towards library-assisted instruction affect their life competence
 - Contents : The statistical analysis of 125 student's learning attitudes(level of interests in learning) towards Library-Assisted Instruction and life competence (communication skill, self-directed learning skill, problem-solving skill) showed that these two variables are closely co-related. As it has been proven that young adults' attitudes toward education influence their life competence; the strategies to promote their interests in library-Assisted Instruction classes are reinforced in order to promote their life competence. This life competence is a basic tool necessary for young children to successfully lead their lives in a society where continuous education is essential.
