In Old Moshi the head of Chief Meli is missing. He bravely resisted the German colonialists and was hanged in 1900. His head is said to have been shipped to Germany, where thousands of human skulls are still stored in museum depots. The grandson of Chief Meli has been searching for it for more than 50 years, until now without success. Yet traces of Chief Meli can be found in songs, stories and archives. A Tanzanian-German team has transformed these into a photographic exhibition and an animated video sculpture.

In a parallel struggle, we meet people around the globe whose lives are dramatically affected by online censorship. A typical "cleaner" must observe and rate thousands of often deeply disturbing images and videos every day, leading to lasting psychological impacts.
