

# INFORMATION AFTER ART. 13 AND ART. 14 DSGVO



## NOTE ON THE PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA IN ACCORDANCE WITH ART. 13 AND 14 General DATA PROTECTION REGULATION (GDPR)

The Goethe-Institut e.V., Oskar-von-Miller-Ring 18, 80333 Munich, hereinafter referred to as "GI", collects and processes your personal data (hereinafter referred to as "data") under the following conditions.

### PURPOSE

We process your data to be able to carry out the application for the online hackathon "The Climate Challenge" (30.10.-1.11.2020).

### LEGAL BASIS

Data processing is always only permitted if one or more of the legal bases listed below are present.

#### 1. Consent (Art. 6 para. 1 a) DSGVO)

The processing is based on your consent. This is the legal basis for the processing. The consent is voluntary. You can revoke your consent at any time with effect for the future.

#### 2. Fulfilment of contractual obligations (Art. 6 para. 1 b) DSGVO)

The processing is based on contractual obligations between you and the Goethe-Institut. The personal data is required to carry out the legal relationship.

#### 3. Fulfilment of legal obligations (Art. 6 para. 1 c) DSGVO)

The processing is based on their necessity to fulfil legal obligations to which the Goethe-Institut is subject. We may process your data for identity verification, fulfilment of tax obligations and for documentation in the event of an inspection by an authority. The disclosure of personal data may become necessary within the framework of official or judicial measures for the purpose of gathering evidence, criminal prosecution or the enforcement of civil law claims.

#### 4. Protection of legitimate interests (Art. 6 para. 1 f) DSGVO)

The processing is based on a legitimate interest of the Goethe-Institut or a third party.

The specific processing of your data for the purpose(s) indicated above will be carried out on the legal basis of the point 2.

## **CATEGORIES OF PERSONAL DATA TO BE PROCESSED**

We process the following data about you:

- Your name,
- Your place of residence,
- Your nationality,
- Your professional status,
- Your special knowledge,
- Your LinkedIn or Xing profile, if applicable,
- The data that may be generated during the zoom meetings (photo/video recordings and metadata of the photo/video material)

In the case of processing in accordance with Art. 6 para. 1 b) DSGVO, the following applies: Without the data you have provided us within the run-up to the conclusion of the contract, the conclusion of the contract is not possible.

## **TRANSFER TO THIRD PARTIES**

Your personal data will not be passed on to third parties.

## **TRANSFER TO A THIRD COUNTRY**

Your personal data will not be transferred to so-called third countries.

### **In the case of the creation and publication of image and/or sound recordings, the following applies:**

The recordings will also be passed on to Goethe-Institutes abroad and cooperation partners for the aforementioned purposes. In this case, the data may be transferred outside the country in which it was collected. Data will only be transferred to third parties if the EU Commission has determined that an adequate level of protection is guaranteed for the country in question, or if the "standard data protection clauses" issued by the EU Commission (<https://eurlex.europa.eu/legal-content/DE/TXT/?uri=CELEX%3A32010D0087>) have been agreed with the recipient. When the data is published, particularly on the Internet, it may also be accessed in countries where an adequate level of data protection is not guaranteed.

## **DURATION OF DATA STORAGE**

We store your data as long as they are required for one of the above-mentioned purposes or a legal retention period is prescribed.

## **THEIR RIGHTS AND HOW TO CONTACT THEM**

Information: Upon request, we will be happy to inform you whether and which data about you has been stored.

Correction, restriction of processing or deletion: If the legal requirements are met, you have the right to correct, restrict processing or delete this data.

Data Output: You also have the right to receive from us the data you have provided us within a structured, common and machine-readable format; you may transmit this data to other parties or have it transmitted to them.

**Objection:** You may object at any time to the processing of your data, which is carried out on the legal basis of Art. 6 paragraph 1 letter f) DPA, for reasons arising from your particular situation. We will then no longer process your data unless we can prove that there are overriding compelling reasons for processing worthy of protection or the processing serves to assert, exercise or defend legal claims.

**The following applies to data processing on the basis of consent pursuant to Art. 6 para. 1 a) DSGVO: Right of revocation upon consent.**

**If you have given your consent to the processing of your personal data in the course of concluding the contract, you can revoke this consent at any time for the future. The lawfulness of the data processing carried out on the basis of the consent until the revocation is not affected by this.**
