The 14th round table discussion is organized by the Ukrainian Center for Holocaust Studies and Goethe-Institut in Ukraine.

In 2005, the UN General Assembly adopted the Resolution No. 60/7 on the Holocaust Remembrance, which designates the 27th of January as an annual International Day of Commemoration in memory of the victims of the Holocaust. The Resolution claims the importance of the Holocaust remembrance and education in order to prevent the future acts of genocide and the outburst of hatred, fanaticism, racism, and prejudices.

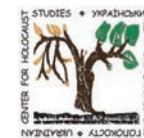
