Space: The space is 14m by 5m with a 3.6m-high ceiling. The floor is solid wood flooring. Some furniture can be provided on request.

Ventilation: The space is equipped with air filtration systems. The large windows on both sides can be opened for optimal air flow.

Light and Sound: The space has dimmable lighting and natural light from high windows along the two short sides. Natural light can be blacked out on one side with blinds. With prior arrangement, a sound system, screen and projector can be made available.

Wi-Fi: free throughout the building, please contact reception for login details.

Access: The Goethe-Institut Glasgow is located in a listed building which, unfortunately, limits our influence on accessibility. Please make us aware of any access requirements during the booking process.

Opening times: Our general opening times are between 9am and 6pm.

SEMINAR ROOM

Our seminar room on the ground floor is well suited for meetings, classes and group activities.





Space: Our seminar room on the ground floor is 5m x 6m and is equipped with a large white board. It can be furnished with tables and chairs to accommodate up to 12 people seated. Other meeting spaces on the first floor might be available upon request.

Technical equipment: The room is equipped with a large white board connected to a laptop, available for use with prior arrangement. Alternatively, you can connect your own laptop.

Wifi: free throughout the building, please contact reception for login details.

Ventilation: The room can be ventilated by opening the large windows on one side.

Light: The rooms can be semi-darkened by blinds if viewing things on screen.

THE 'OUTHOUSE'

Separate from the main building, the Outhouse sits in the back garden, away from traffic and passers-by.





Space: The Outhouse is a low, single-storey structure with an interior divided into two connected spaces. The first space has three casement windows, two next to the outer door, and one at one end of the building. There are bars over the windows and two of the windows can be opened. The wall facing the outer door has no openings and is finished in white subway tiles that bear traces of earlier structures. The ceiling has been opened to the wooden rafters in both spaces. There are three steps up to the second space, which is smaller and suitable for projections/film screenings and VR galleries – the single window is fitted with a blackout covering which darkens the room considerably though not totally. The walls and floor are unfinished concrete. Dimensions:

260x515cm = 13,39 m2 and 245x360cm = 8,82 m2 = Total Area: 22,21 m2

Ventilation: Two of the windows can be opened.

Light: Both rooms have overhead lighting and infrared heaters.

Access: The Goethe-Institut Glasgow is located in a listed building which, unfortunately, limits our influence on accessibility. Please make us aware of any access requirements during the booking process. Metered street parking is available directly in front of the building.
