Andreas Dresen (b. 1963) is one of Germany's most admired directors, with numerous diverse and awardwinning feature films to his name. Born in Gera, East Germany, he begar working in theater and making short films in the early 1980s. He studied directing at the HFF "Konrad Wolf" Potsdam-Babelsberg, Since 1992, he has been working as a writer and director for film, TV, theater, and opera.
