With its Web Residencies, Akademie Schloss Solitude has been supporting artists, designers, cyborgs, hackers and researchers who use digital space since 2016 (collaborating with the ZKM | Center for Art and Media Karlsruhe from 2017-2020). The program takes place exclusively online. Artists are invited to experiment with digital technologies and new art forms, and reflect on the topics set by the curators or curatorial collectives. Artists are rewarded with a four to eight weeks residency and 750 Euro.



Artists' houses support professional artists of all disciplines by providing them with studio space and accommodation for limited periods of time, often combined with the award of a stipend or grant. They are international meeting places and centres of cultural and creative exchange.

Künstlerhaus Schloss Balmoral

- The artists' residence Künstlerhaus Schloss Balmoral in Bad Ems awards four- and eight-month residency grants to visual artists from Germany and abroad whose artistic work has a clear connection to the topic or genre of the respective application round.
- The Künstlerhaus Schloss Balmoral in Bad Ems is an institution of the Kunsthochschule Mainz of the Johannes Gutenberg University of Mainz and supports international visual artists with residency grants. The Künstlerhaus also manages the project, travel and exchange grants for artists with a connection to Rhineland-Palatinate.
- The fellowships are endowed with 1,400 € a month plus subsidy to the travel costs for arrival.
- a furnished room in the artists' residence for living and sleeping, with shower/WC and a studio.
- The Künstlerhaus has the task of promoting visual artists. Balmoral is a place of encounter, reflection, creation and (artistic) knowledge production. The Künstlerhaus is a center for contemporary art that has an impact on the public through exhibitions and various events. It's a place of vision.
- Target group: National and international fine artists who have completed an arts degree (Master's or equal) and subsequently worked as an artist for three years prior to taking up their scholarship. Applications from autodidacts who have demonstrably produced outstanding artistic work are also accepted. Applicants' artistic work must focus on a particular genre or a certain topic specified for each round of applications.
- In addition, an eight-month curator scholarship is awarded every year.
- Scholarship benefits: The scholarship includes a grant of 1,400 EUR per month, a furnished bed-/living room with bathroom, and a studio. A lounge, dining room and kitchen are available for communal use. Three of the scholarships are awarded for four months and three for eight months.
 - Three 4-month Balmoral residential fellowships (application form available only during the application period)
 - Three 8-month Balmoral residential fellowships (application form available only during the application period)
- Formalities: Visit the website of the Künstlerhaus to view the application documents. Application rounds usually begin in March each year when that year's topic is announced and run up to end of April. Usually, the residential scholarships start in April of the following year. The jurors select the scholarship holders based on submitted work samples which are reviewed by a specialist jury focusing in particular on the work's potential for development.

The Künstlerdorf Schöppingen emphasizes collegial advice and knowledge exchange in a supportive and non-competitive setting.

Stipend-funded fellowship of two to six months enables the realisation of projects in the fields of literature, visual arts and composition.

By awarding attendance scholarships without age restriction, the Künstlerhaus at the Baltic Sea offers its international scholarship holders a place for artistic production and theoretical reflection across disciplinary boundaries. The support of projects at the interface of art and environment is another exposed focus. With a special grant for curators, artistic explorations of ecological issues are promoted.
- Closely linked to the Künstlerhaus Lukas is the Neue Kunsthaus Ahrenshoop, a public forum for art and contemporary issues. The Neues Kunsthaus Ahrenshoop regularly hosts public exhibitions, art festivals, symposia, readings, concerts, workshops, film screenings and performances with the scholarship holders.

Artists Unlimited Bielefeld

Artists Unlimited is an artists association and art house that combines living and working under one roof since 1985. The project runs a gallery and a guest studio and has until now financed three-month-grants for 91 guest artists from all over the world. They live in the Artists Unlimited house – a former paper factory building – and exhibit their creations in the projects gallery.

They offer a studio space (40m²) which is located next door to a private appartment (32m²). Inside, there is a sleeping area, a kitchen, washing machine and Wi-Fi. The residency space is located on the first floor of our building, which used to be a paper factory 30 years ago. The studio and the apartment are private, though the guest artists share the floor with two neighbours who also have their private appartments there. Artists Unlimited pays for the monthly rent and grants of 600 Euro a month. Travelling expenses have to be paid for by the artist, though.

Edith-Russ-Haus for Media Art

The Edith-Russ-Haus for Media Art will award three Grants for Media Art of the Stiftung Niedersachsen (€12,500 each). The Foundation of Lower Saxony grant at the Edith-Russ-Haus for Media Art supports a wide spectrum of media art, from video art and net-based projects to audio works and audio-visual installations. Each of the three grants will be awarded for the production of a new project in the area of media art.

An international jury will convene to select the recipients of the grants.

The grant is valid for a duration of six months (July–December). It cannot be prolonged and residency is compulsory; grant recipients can expect to stay in Oldenburg at least one month.

Künstlerhaus otte1

The board of friends of otte1 - Schleswig-Holsteinisches Künstlerhaus annually awards grants from the Ministry of Education, Science and Culture of the State of Schleswig-Holstein - subject to coverage by the state budget. Applications are open to artists in the fields of visual arts, music/composition and literature. Every two years, a curatorial scholarship is offered separately for the management of the house.An international jury will convene to select the recipients of the grants.

Scholarships are awarded to persons who are not older than 40 years or whose university degree was completed no more than five years ago. The fellowships are awarded as three-month work and residency fellowships.

Applications are made through a portfolio. A concrete project does not necessarily have to be carried out; research and the development of project approaches are also eligible for funding.

The amount of a scholarship is currently 1,000 euros per month.

Künstlerhaus Edenkoben

The Künstlerhaus Edenkoben awards up to seven scholarships for authors/translators and 2 scholarships for visual arts every year. There are four apartments and a studio in the house - all living units are fully furnished and have an internet connection. The scholarship holders receive a monthly allowance of 1,200 euros. In addition, the costs of travel to and from the residence are reimbursed.

The Edenkoben scholarships are generally only valid for one person and are attendance scholarships; a continuous stay is therefore obligatory.

Artists of any age, nationality or place of residence may apply. The Künstlerhaus Lauenburg is characterized by its individual support and the networking of the scholarship holders with each other, as well as with the cultural scene of the metropolitan region of Hamburg and Schleswig-Holstein.

Every year, Künstlerhaus Lauenburg regularly announces 3 residency fellowships in the fields of composition, literature and visual arts and awards one fellowship in the field of visual arts by invitation to an artist. Artists can apply for the 3 residency fellowships without restriction of age or residence.

Artist in Residency Munich

The program is open for applications from the fields of art, culture, and the sciences. There are two residency houses, the average stay is three months.

It is possible to apply for a residency as a guest artist through the open calls for applications, or by being suggested for the program by one of their Munich cooperation partners. Open calls are regularly published on the homepage. Unsolicited applications will only be considered in exceptional cases – for example, when other artists cancel on short notice.

Artists suggested for the program must reside outside of Bavaria. Guest artists who stay at one of the residences will receive a monthly grant of € 1,200 and a reimbursement for a monthly ticket for the local public transportation system.

Künstlergut Prösitz

The Saxon artists' residence "Künstlergut Prösitz" invites applications for four-week participations in the Europe-wide unique symposium within May to October annually. The aim of the symposium is to enable professional artists to work sculpturally / installatively during the four working weeks at the Künstlergut.

Unique and special is that the scholarship is addressed to female artists who are also mothers. The Prösitzer Symposium allows them to bring their children with them. Childcare will be provided for the children (maximum age 12 years) at the Künstlergut Prösitz during the four-week residency. This allows the women to devote themselves to their artistic work, to exchange ideas with colleagues in the same life situation and also to network ideally.

The scholarship amounts to 500,- Euro. There are no costs for accommodation or childcare. Various additional services (materials, organizational aids, etc.) are provided on an individual basis. Afterwards, a joint exhibition of all scholarship holders will be organized. A joint catalog will be published for this exhibition.

Stiftung Starke

The "artist in residence" program is the key to the purpose of the Starke Foundation. For a period of 3-12 months, the foundation will provide residential and working premises to selected artists. Besides this long term support for young artists, shortterm apartments for established artists are available. In addition the Starke Foundation arranges numerous national and international contacts to museums, galleries and public institutions as well as to representatives in the fields of culture, science, economy, sports and politics. The meeting between young art and business is also an important part of the program.

Furthermore, the "Artist in Residence" program gives the artists the opportunity to present their projects created during their stay at the Löwenpalais to a wide public in the mansion's own gallery after their scholarship has ended. The projects of the Starke foundation are also accompanied scientifically by international curators.

The individual studio rooms are approx. 25m² in size.

Artist Visa

If you are an artist planning to work on a freelance base, holding a passport from Australia, Israel, Japan, Canada, New Zealand, South Korea or the US, you can apply for an artist visa in Berlin and Hamburg.

The artist visa, is a special residence permit (a subcategory of the freelance visa, §21), which only can be obtained in Berlin and Hamburg. If you live in another city in Germany, you would have to apply for the "regular" freelance visa.
