Bozar and the Goethe-Institut invite you to discover the outcome of a 2 year-long project of encounters and artistic residencies exploring the cultural interaction and exchanges between Europe and the Arab world: a variety of films, musical creations, performances and visual art and sound installations. All of this will be accompanied by a distillate of new insights and practical Lessons for the Future on cultural relations between the two regions, condensed into a final project publication to be launched in November '22.

A project genuinely rooted within Brussels' urban fabric

Halaqat is a European co-funded project, which was launched with an **Opening Festival** in December '21, followed by numerous **film screenings, concerts, intense discussions, round tables and performances**, all built around the leitmotiv '**Politics of Spaces and Bodies**'. Halaqat (Arabic for a **multitude of links and circles**) has offered a safe and open platform to **meet, exchange and create**, empowering smaller-scale institutions and individual artists from both regions, as well as supporting artists' mobility.

Bozar and the Goethe-Institut have succeeded in creating an ever-growing network: young and upcoming artists from the Arab world, Europe and the Arab diaspora planted **new seeds in the fabric of the city of Brussels** and beyond, meeting local artists as well as partners from both regions: **Atelier Graphoui, Cinemaximiliaan and SIC-SoundImageCulture** for film; **Werkplaats Walter** and **Amman Jazz Festival** for music; **iMAL** and **Cairotronica** for media arts; **La Bellone, Théâtre Marni, Ad'Hoc Platform and Studio 8** for performing arts.

We pick up where we left off

On 6 October '22, Bozar and the Goethe-Institut will pick up the Halaqat thread with a **concert** featuring the **Lebanese pianist Abdel Rahman El Bacha** and the **French-Armenian cellist Astrig Siranossian**.

On 9 November '22, we will move to **Théâtre Marni** to discover the outcomes of the **performing arts residency on 'Politics of Spaces and Bodies'** curated by the **dramaturg, curator and mentor Nedjma Hadj Benchelabi**.

We will then continue in November '22 with the multiday **Halaqat Focus** (18 → 23 November) back at Bozar: **a special moment to discover more about Arab cultures, meet important voices from various backgrounds and get a glimpse of recent artistic production from the Arab world, especially in the fields of visual and performing arts and cinema.**

Lessons for the Future

The November Halaqat Focus kicks off with an opening night on 17 November '22. The guests invited to attend this private vernissage hosted by Bozar and the Goethe-Institut will include **Halaqat-artists and partners, cultural operators based in Belgium, ambassadors and EU representatives**. The evening will provide the ideal context for the experts **Shiran Ben Abderrazak and Silja Fischer** to present and discuss the **Lessons for the Future**, the result of the long and fruitful work realised by a group of engaged and passionate experts during the entire duration of the Halaqat project.

The **Lessons for the Future** are intended to improve cultural exchange and mutual understanding between Europe and the Arab world. They combine expert statements and advice with essays, artistic works and interviews in a final project publication with a foreword by **Nedjma Hadj Benchelabi**.

Through this publication, the Halaqat experts want to emphasise the urgent need to focus on cultural relations between Europe and the Arab world, an urgency made palpable in a city such as Brussels where the existing multicultural basin is constantly being fed by new flows of migration and nourished by the resulting cross-pollination between new and existing artistic and cultural actors.

The **Lessons for the Future** could, in this perspective, also help inform politicians aiming to address any such matters, including during discussions during contacts, for example, between the European Union and the League of Arab States (LAS) as the main regional organisations of the two (Europe and Arab) worlds.

The programme of Halaqat Focus – November '22

The Algerian visual artist Oussama Tabti will present his latest installation, ***Homo-carduelis: Inside the Gilded Cage***, an artwork especially commissioned for Halaqat (accessible to the public from 18 November '22 until 28 January '23 in the Horta Hall of the Centre for Fine Arts). Thirty empty birdcages hanging on the wall, emitting a rising chorus of chirps, trills, silences, and warbles. **The song is that of the goldfinch** (*Carduelis-Carduelis* in Latin), **a symbol of love and liberty** but also a species endangered by domestication: **Tabti orchestrates a mirror image of a society in which both rich and poor have entrapped themselves.**

Halaqat will also offer a platform to the renowned Palestinian artist Emily Jacir who, with her **multimedia billboard in the public space**, will capture the attention of passers-by.

For the entire duration of the festival, Bozar and the Goethe-Institut will present **a film by the writer and journalist Sophie Soukias: 3 Tales of Halaqat**. Soukias' 20-minute poetic documentary offers a **global view and a deep understanding** of the Halaqat project, through the stories of seven Halaqat artists in residence.

On Friday 18 November, the Moroccan multi-disciplinary artist Soukaina Joual will hold her performance ***The Moroccan Sheikha Soukaina***, questioning the notions of witchcraft, superstition, traditional practices, media representations of women and the stereotypical gaze, as well as their ties to feminism. **The performance will be followed by an artist talk about the cultural relations between Europe and the Arab world and the influences of migration on new cultural narratives and on both cultural expression and artists' work.** The journalist Safia Kessas will moderate the talk (in French) and exchange on the subject with Soukaina Joual and Nedjma Hadj Benchelabi, among others.

Halaqat Focus will also introduce the ***Halaqat Film Days – Past and Present of Arab Societies through Women's Lenses***, a film panorama dedicated to different generations of female directors from the Arab world (from 19 to 23 November, and then again on 3 and 5 December, at Bozar), including a tribute to the late and sorely missed **Dalila Ennadre** and a focus on **Algerian cinema**: *Ali au pays des merveilles* by **Djouhra Abouda** and *Their Algeria*, in the presence of director **Lina Soualem**. The programme, jointly curated by Bozar, the Goethe-Institut, the **Mahmoud Darwish Chair** and **Cinemamed**, will present **archive films** brought back to the screens after being **restored**, accompanied by **screenings of more recent productions** and **conversations** with the artists.



To resist is to create!

9 artists from the Arab world and Europe - choreographers, performers and sound designers - explore with the Halaqat theme of Politics of Spaces and Bodies.

The Moroccan Sheikha Soukaina Soukaina Joual

18 Nov.'22- 19:00

Through a variety of aesthetic forms — narration, performative reading, found objects, soundtracks, and images — this performance (30 min) weaves different social and personal events into one tapestry. From the island of Sidi Abderahman in Casablanca to the neighbour of Miami in Alexandria and even a digital space. **The artist tries to question the notions of witchcraft, superstition, traditional practices, media representations of women, the stereotypical gaze, and their ties to feminism.** How is the figure of the witch perceived by society? What kind of knowledge is transmitted, preserved, and possibly transformed within communities that still practice witchcraft to date? And most importantly, **what role and position may the cultural, religious, and magical rites play in establishing and sustaining cultural hegemony?**

The performance will be followed by a discussion (90 min) with Soukaina Joual, Oussama Tabti, Nadia Cherif and Nedjma Hadj Benchelabi, moderated by Safia Kessas. Brussels, a hyper diverse city, is at the crossroads of migratory flows. This debate will zoom in on how these migration phenomena influence new cultural narratives by allowing an exchange between artists already present, and newcomers. How does it impact and nourish artistic creation? These exchanges are evocative of images: some speak of entanglement, others of (positive) contamination or cross-pollination. What changes does it bring about? And what are the limits to this phenomenon?

Oussama Tabti : 'Homo-carduelis' Inside the Gilded Cage

18 Nov.'22 - 29 Jan.'23

Through 30 empty birdcages, a choir of chirps, trills, silences, and warbles emanates. You can hear the song of the **goldfinch** or *El Meknine* in Algeria, where it has become a **treasured companion**. The bird grew to be a **symbol of love and liberty**, but its existence has become **endangered and rhythmed by its domestication**. While we sing of the finch's flight and beauty, **have we become entrapped ourselves?** A portrait of the willed mindlessness of the masses, of the ever-present **disillusion of a life circumscribed by the iron cage of rationalization and self-indoctrination**.

Oussama Tabti (Algeria, 1988) is a **visual artist** who lives and works in Brussels. His work questions hermetic geopolitics. In his own way he **denounces the difficulty of moving in a world that is globalized but also suspicious, frightened by the 'stranger' and by difference.**

Tribute to Dalila Ennadre - Screening El Batalett

The action takes place in the heart of the **old Medina in Casablanca**. The film portrays a **group of women** who have lived there since childhood. Together, they offer a **complex image of the popular Moroccan woman, a modern and urban woman**, far removed from the orientalist clichés that describe her as submissive or lustful. **Through the eyes of these Batalett (heroines)** who recreate a small world of their own every day, we experience major events in Morocco at the beginning of the 21st century.

Dalila Ennadre (1966) was born in Casablanca. She is **self-taught** and has made **several documentary films** on subjects related to **Moroccan society**. Her films have won **awards at documentary film festivals around the world**. She was a producer at Laya Prod until her death from a long illness while editing her last film in May 2020.

In this **experimental, political and radical film** about the **experience of immigrant workers in France in the mid-1970s**, *Ali au Pays des Merveilles* calls out the **exploitation** and **racism** it ascribes to the French state, the media, capitalism and colonisation. Shot in 16mm, the film **combines a formal and aesthetic inventiveness with a powerful militant purpose**, through the direct dialogue of **marginalised people**.

Born in a village in the Djurdjura mountains in Kabylia (Algeria) in the late 1940s, **Djouhra Abouda** (1949) arrived in France with her father at the age of five. In the 1980s she founded the Djurdjura group, with whom she produced several music albums before devoting herself to her solo career. In the 1970s, Djouhra Abouda produced and directed three film projects with architect Alain Bonnamy (1947): *Algérie couleurs* (1970-1972), *Cinécité* (1973-1974) et *Ali au Pays des Merveilles* (1975-1976).



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

In *Unfolding an Archive*, she delves into his archive of 20 years of war reporting, which overlaps with her own childhood. The result is a solo full of memories, sounds, movements and stories. (MB)

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

Tuimel het najaar in bij

Bozar

De centrale gast van de herfst is Laurie Anderson, een avant-garde icoon van het New York in de jaren 70.



Je kan er concerten beleven in de mooiste art deco-zaal van Europa, door blockbustertentoonstellingen wandelen, of in intieme kring met een beroemd auteur aan de praat raken. Honderd jaar geleden, toen de artistieke disciplines nog streng in hokjes waren opgedeeld, was de geboorte van Bozar (toen bekend als het Paleis voor Schone Kunsten) revolutionair: alle kunsten onder één dak verzamelen. Du jamais vu! Vandaag heeft deze Europese pionier overal navolging gekregen, maar zoals de avontuurlijke mix van dit najaar aantoon: *no one does it quite like Bozar*.

De centrale gast van de herfst is - net als Bozar zelf - een creatieve duizendpoot, een grote dame die nog steeds vernieuwend en verrassend uit de hoek komt. Laurie Anderson is een avant-garde icoon van het New York in de jaren 70, een muzikaal avonturier, maar ook filmmaker, beeldend kunstenaar, en uitvinder. Al die facetten komen aan bod wanneer Anderson vanaf november Bozar overneemt. Ze brengt de wereldpremière van haar nieuw werk *All the Animals*, deelt het podium met een symfonisch orkest én artificial intelligence, toont twee van haar films, en neemt je mee naar de maan in een adembenemende *virtual reality*-installatie (vanaf 15.11).

Vrouwen met een camera

Ook regisseur Chantal Akerman is een kunstenares die moeilijk in een hokje te stoppen valt. Haar werk wordt getoond in bioscopen en in musea, en hoewel haar eigenzinnig werk en vroege dood ervoor zorgden dat ze voor het grote publiek in de marge van de filmgeschiedenis is gebleven, wordt ze veraf goed als pionier van de feministische cinema. Haar fans zijn niet de minsten: Gus van Sant, Claire Denis, Apichatpong Weerasethakul of Todd Haynes. Bozar toont een video-installatie van Akerman waarin ze fragmenten uit enkele van haar bekendste films mengt met persoonlijke memoires (07.10.'22 tot 15.01.'23).

Vrouwen met een camera, maar dan in de Arabische wereld, vormen de focus van de Halaqat Film Days (19.11 tot 05.12). Verschillende generaties filmmaaksters tonen zo'n 50 jaar film, gemaakt door vrouwen die hun lens richten op vrouwen. Volksvrouwen in Casablanca, gastarbeidsters in Frankrijk, Algerijnse grootmoeders en Syrische apothekeressen bevolken films met een brede blik, van relaties tot revoluties, van magisch realisme tot documentaire.

Arabische herfst

Is er sprake van een Arabische herfst bij Bozar? Misschien wel. Tussen de vele kunstenaars en muzikanten uit de regio dit najaar zit Oum: een echte ster in Marokko die ook in Europa naam heeft gemaakt met songs waarin ze traditionele Noord-Afrikaanse stijlen vermengt met soul, jazz en elektronica. Bij Bozar werkt Oum (26.11) samen met de Cubaanse saxofonist M-Carlos en zingt ze over haar meervoudige identiteiten door Darija (Marokkaans-Arabisch dialect), Frans, Engels en Spaans te mixen.

Een uitgelezen plek in de Arabische wereld om het te hebben over culturen die elkaar tegenkomen is de Egyptische stad Alexandrië. Sinds de Oudheid een haast mythisch kruispunt van beschavingen en religies, en vaak naar voren geschoven als de ultieme multiculturele metropool. Maar heeft de mythe ooit bestaan? De fascinerende tentoonstelling *Alexandrië: vervlogen toekomst* (nog tot 08.01.'23) blikt terug op de gloriejaren van de antieke grootstad aan de hand van een 200-tal werken uit de grootste Europese museumcollecties. Hedendaagse kunstenaars vullen het archeologische verhaal aan en plaatsen kritische vraagtekens bij dominante verhalen over macht en geschiedenis.



Meesterwerk van Mahler

Ook de klassieke muziek is erfgoed dat zich steeds leent tot nieuwe lezingen en frisse perspectieven. De allerbeste muzikanten brengen hun eigen interpretatie van de grote meesterwerken uit het repertoire. Zo gaan het London Philharmonic Orchestra en hun sterdirigent Vladimir Jurowski het laatste grote meesterwerk van Mahler te lijf, zijn *Negende Symfonie* (06.12). Phillip Herreweghe en zijn Collegium Vocale wagen zich aan Beethovens magnum opus: de *Missa solemnis* (17.12). Maar het Chineke! Orchestra (19.11) opent deze herfst ook nieuwe wegen. Chi-chi Nwanoku richtte een professioneel orkest op met uitsluitend zwarte musici of musici die behoren tot een etnische minderheid. In hun concerten combineert Chineke! steeds werken uit het bekende repertoire (bij Bozar de *Negende Symfonie* van Dvorák) met composities van zwarte componisten. Werken van Samuel Coleridge-Taylor, George Walker en Florence Price nemen zo eindelijk hun rechtmatige plaats in in de muziekgeschiedenis, die steeds wordt verrijkt en vernieuwd door de muzikanten en het publiek van vandaag.

Bozar ten voeten uit

Laten we tot slot terugkeren naar de plaats waar het allemaal gebeurt. In Nino Haratischwili's recentste roman kwamen de vier hoofdpersonages elkaar opnieuw tegen op een wel heel bijzondere locatie ... in het Paleis voor Schone Kunsten! Haratischwili, de Georgische schrijfster van de internationale bestseller *Het achtste leven*, komt naar Brussel om het met Annelies Beck te hebben over geschiedenis en actualiteit, literatuur en de kracht van verhalen (2.11). Kom elkaar en jezelf weer tegen dit najaar, in een cultuurhuis waar kunstenaars geschiedenis schrijven en film als muziek in de oren klinkt. Dat is Bozar ten voeten uit. ❤



Six jours de célébration à Bozar

Du cinéma mais pas que ! Plusieurs artistes présenteront leurs œuvres, à l'instar de Soukaina Joual qui performera, le 18 novembre, The Moroccan Sheikha Soukaina en interrogeant les notions de sorcellerie, de superstition, de pratiques traditionnelles et de regards posés par les médias sur les femmes.

La pièce sera suivie d'un débat modéré par Safia Kessas en compagnie des artistes du festival Soukaina Joual, Oussama Tabti, Nedjma Hadj Benchelabi et Nadia Cherif. Le cœur de la discussion : les relations culturelles entre l'Europe et le monde, et les influences de la migration sur les nouveaux récits et sur l'expression artistique.



Concernant le panorama cinématographique, il sera consacré à différentes générations de réalisatrices du monde arabe. "L'idée c'est vraiment de donner plus la parole aux femmes et de mettre en avant la manière dont elles voient leur région", éclare Dounya Hallaq, assistante de projet Halaqat pour le Goethe Institut. Au programme notamment, un femmage à Dalila Ennadre et un focus sur le cinéma algérien avec Ali au pays des merveilles par Djouhra Abouda et Leur Algérie de Lina Soualem.

Mais aussi les projections de Happily Ever After, additionné d'un Q&A avec la réalisatrice Nada Riyadh, de Return to the Land of Wonders, suivi d'une rencontre avec la réalisatrice Maysoon Pachachi et de The Day I Lost My Shadow, également prolongé d'un échange avec la réalisatrice Soudade Kaadan.

Créer des ponts culturels

Les Halaqat Film Days s'inscrivent dans le vaste projet européen Halaqat qui représente plus de deux ans d'activités artistiques autour des relations culturelles entre l'Union européenne et le monde arabe. "Nous avons travaillé avec différents partenaires culturels sur trois axes : les événements publics – des projections de films comme lors des Halaqat Film Days, des débats, des spectacles et concerts -, les résidences artistiques, et les tables rondes de penseur·euses entre les deux rives de la Méditerranée", explique Maud Qamar, coordinatrice du projet pour le Goethe Institut.

Halaqat (terme arabe signifiant "liens et cercles multiples") s'articule autour de quatre disciplines : le cinéma, la musique, les arts de la scène et les arts visuels. "Notre objectif, c'est vraiment d'ouvrir le dialogue et de soutenir les artistes", continue la coordinatrice.



La publication finale du projet, préfacée par Nedjma Hadj Benchelabi, donne échos aux débats Lessons for the Future qui ont été (et sont encore) organisés durant ces deux années. Cet ouvrage constitue des déclarations et conseils d'expert·es, des essais, des œuvres artistiques et des entretiens.

"Certes, nous sommes une institution allemande, mais nous observons une nécessité d'entrer plus en dialogue avec le monde arabe. Par exemple, toute la solidarité autour de la guerre en Ukraine a créé d'énormes frustrations, notamment dans la communauté syrienne qui a bien remarqué que l'accueil n'avait pas toujours été le même. Il faut s'intéresser à ces cultures, mais pas juste en superficie, il est nécessaire d'écouter les artistes", conclut Maud Qamar.



Dance. Bodies. Politics

Europe and the Arab world are two rapidly changing regions, each with specific and varied local social, economic and political realities, but above all with many connections, historical and present. Building on these connections, the Goethe-Institut and Bozar are launching the project *Halaqat*. *Halaqat* – which in Arabic means multiple links and circles – aims to strengthen these entanglements and build bridges between both regions.



The term “the body” began to be used frequently in poststructuralist and post-foundationalist cultural theory and philosophy throughout the last quarter of the 20th century. The term “bodies” has recently gained prominence in scholarly discussions as well as in activist discourses and regular forms of cultural expression. This language, which is mostly Anglophone, refers to bodies as subjects rather than objects (‘we are/there are bodies’).

Through a prior or ongoing shift to a consensus that referring to “bodies” as such is to name them as the locus of socio-political agency in preference to or in distinction from other terms, “bodies” as the fundamental unit that counts humans in (a) space assumes the status of a convention.

On the other hand, the diversity of cultures is a topic at the centre of discussion, not only in political frameworks, but also in artistic practices.

Bridges and paths to a dialogue between cultures are needed and art is a medium that can help build these bridges. Cultural exchange and intercultural encounters need places, forums and occasions: the project Halaqat creates the possibilities and forms of encounter, cultural exchange and the cultivation of cultural partnerships between the West and the Arab world.



A joint program between The Goethe-Institut, Bozar – Center for Fine Arts Brussels, the Marni Theater, La Bellone and Ad'Hoc Platform brings you through a contemporary journey of artistic imaginaries shared by the Arab world and Europe and focuses on the diversity and richness of cultural collaborations today to support and strengthen them in the future.

To investigate the theme of the body in relation with politics, nine Arab choreographers, artists, and sound designers based in Europe or the Arab world have been chosen. They have been invited to Brussels for an artist's residence that would allow them to interact, experiment with their body language, and give performances. They offer a new space of conviviality where the personal and the political are intricately

connected, bringing a wide variety of contemporary artistic practices. Their performances push past the boundaries of the realities at the nexus of various academic fields to create fresh opportunities.

Halaqat is a series of events hosted by different institutions in Brussels, going on until December. The full program can be found [here](#).



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



onderzoek en dialoog

Misschien minder zichtbaar waren drie rondetafevenementen waar 27 experten uit Europa en de Arabische wereld in dialoog gingen met cultuuractoren, wat resulteerde in de publicatie die voorligt. Thema's als mobiliteit en subsidiëring van cultuur uit beide regio's en hoe garanties te bieden bij het scheppen van voorwaarden om tot culturele uitwisseling te komen (artistieke vrijheid, tegengaan van postkoloniale reflexen) worden in de publicatie aangeraakt.

meer resultaat

Sinds mid november is voor Halaqat een nieuwe fase aangebroken, een fase die Halaqat 'bij de mensen' moet brengen. Halaqat Focus, een meerdaagse programmatie van Bozar, ligt al in het verleden maar tot 31 januari 2023 is er in Brussel nog een waaier aan performances, film, kunst en muziekoptredens mee te maken. Het kan niet enkel het begrip voor de verschillende culturen die de Brusselse realiteit uitmaken versterken maar misschien zowel in Europa als in de Arabische wereld een steen verleggen in woelige rivieren die meanderen tussen moderniteit en traditie.




Last chance

This weekend will see several dance and theatre performances across Brussels come to a close. All events mentioned below run until Saturday 21 January.

At KVS, a trio of performers play on the idea of flying in **PUNKT, the latest creation of Bahar Temiz** who took stories of the first balloon explorers as the starting point for her choreography. The performance walks the line between dance and visual arts to explore themes such as elevation, expansion, air, breath and change of perspective.

SIMPLE at the Théâtre National Wallonie-Bruxelles, three kids in an adult body use movement as a driving force to investigate simplicity in a cheeky, deeply jubilant and playful way, cheerfully performing the most improbable gestures, using the stage as an artistic playground to arouse the interest and the laughter of the public.

On the other end of the age spectrum, **Annette at Theatre Les Tanneurs** explores the life, body and soul of a 73-year-old woman, her physical sensations and memories, and the encounters that changed her life. This performance, ranging from individual storytelling to group dance, offers an alternative perspective on age, as a new youth and a liberation.

Previously showcased in the UK, **Gary Owen's Violence and Son** is now taking to **the Théâtre de Poche stage**. The play tells the story of Liam, a young boy who lost his mother and is forced to move to the Welsh Valleys, a former mining area ravaged by unemployment to live with a violent, drunken father he doesn't know.

Finally, at **Théâtre des Martyrs**, Georges Lini explores **Ivanov**, the character of the four-act drama by the Russian playwright Anton Chekhov, which was first performed in 1887, presents a psychodrama of a modern man entangled in his existential pain and worn down by his lucid ruminations.

If you miss the Brussels performance, the play is also on from 25 January to 4 February at the Vilar in Louvain-la-Neuve.
