RECOGNITION PROCEDURE

The recognition procedure always works on a case-by-case basis. It is subject to various regulations and involves contacting various public services. The procedure takes up to four months and usually costs between €100 and €600.

FAST-TRACK

PROCEDURE If you already have a job offer in Germany, your prospective employer can apply to fast-track your recognition procedure as a skilled worker or specialist. It takes at least four months and costs €411 (paid by your employer).

IT PROFESSIONS

IT specialists can obtain a residence permit even without any formal professional qualifications.

Prerequisites for Federal Employment Agency approval: Skilled employment in ion for at least 3 years (within the last 7 years), salary at least 60% of the annual social security contribution assessment ceiling under the statutory pension scheme, **B1-level German language** proficiency.

TRAINING IN GERMANY TO OBTAIN PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATIONS

You can apply for a visa to enter Germany for training to acquire or improve your professional skills. The requirements depend on whether you already have a firm employment offer:



- Proof of enrolment in the training programme and payment of fees
- part-time up to 10 hours per week) Approval from the Federal Employment Agency
- generally required)

- German language proficiency (A2 level is generally required)

Once you are in Germany, you can convert your entry visa into a residence permit for up to 18 months, which can be subsequently renewed up to 24 months.

LANGUAGE SKILLS

GERMAN

German courses are not part of the training programme. You can find the right course for your language level at www.goethe.de.

APPLYING FOR A JOB

You can apply for any job for which you are qualified. You'll find information about employment and job opportunities at e.g. the Federal Employment Agency (www.arbeitsagentur.de) and "Make it in Germany" (www.make-it-in-germany.com). N.B. For some occupations you will have to pass a test of knowledge/know-how and technical German language skills first.

VISA FOR JOB-HUNTING

Requirements: Federal Employment Agency approval, at least B1-level German language proficiency, your qualifications acquired abroad are recognized in Germany or comparable to corresponding German qualifications, and hours a week on a trial basis.
