In this project, you exchange ideas about specific situations that your classmates have experienced. You suggest what you would do or what would be the right course of action.





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You should interview classmates or friends about the bullying situations they have experienced. The interviewees should talk about them anonymously and not give any names. Discuss the following points in your group and take notes.

Note: Please note that this assignment step is only about collecting as many situations as possible. The interviewed persons can of course express their opinion or add what could be done in the situation, but it is not required.
