B. Find out more about the project.

The project: Starting in 1982, Beuys planted 7000 oak trees over the course of several years in Kassel, Germany. To finance and coordinate the project, Beuys specifically founded a coordination office in cooperation with the city of Kassel.



The material: For this project, Beuys used young trees as well as basalt stones. At the start of the project, he piled up all 7000 basalt stones on the Friedrich square in Kassel. Every time a new tree was planted, a stone was removed from the pile and placed as marker next to each planted tree.



The solidarity: A project of this magnitude was difficult for a single person to complete let alone finance. Over the years, Beuys was assisted by many volunteers. For 500 Deutsche Mark (ca. \$280), anyone could sponsor a new tree. Furthermore, the project was only completed in 1987 – one year after Beuys had passed away.

C. Find out more about the symbolism and meaning behind the artwork.

The background: The project was a response to increasing urbanization developments in Germany. Beuys considered the project an artistic and ecological intervention, with the goal to sustainably change the environment.



The materials: Beuys wanted to restore nature's rights by growing the tree population. Knowing that the small scope of the project was at best a symbolic beginning, he chose basalt columns as the marker for the new start. The gradual completion of the project was meant to symbolize progress towards the goal of ecological restoration.



The reception & legacy: In the beginning the project was met with some controversy. People thought the basalt markers were ugly or possibly posing a risk to motorists. Over time, acceptance increased and today, Beuys' project symbolizes an integral part of the Kasseler cityscape.
