Makoma is the 2018 'Goldman Environmental Prize' recipient for her role in building a broad coalition to stop the South African government's secret nuclear deal with Russia; and the director of Earthlife Africa Johannesburg - an environmental justice activist anti-nuclear organisation.

After six months of implementation, the successful Collaboration grantees will present their projects and findings through documentary and a sit-down conversation with guests.

In the background guests will enjoy music by DJ Mamthug and food by Lady Day.
