The Goethe-Institut commemorates Yolanda with the Presentation of Photo Stories from the Climate Change project

The Goethe-Institut in partnership with the Peace and Conflict Journalism Network (PECOJON) presents photo stories in commemoration of Yolanda on its first anniversary. Six photo stories documenting life in and around Tacloban city half a year after the typhoon will be shown in a video presentation throughout the country.

The presentations of photo stories are a part of the Climate Change Photography project of the Goethe-Institut. The project started as a competition for young photographers followed by a workshop in November 2013. The workshop was supervised by mentors **Veejay Villafranca**, **Charlie Saceda** and **Andy Spyra**, seasoned photojournalists from here and Germany. After the tragedy of Yolanda, the Goethe-Institut, in partnership with PECOJON, decided to continue the project. In June 2014, six participants from the 2013 workshop (**Eden Jhan Licayan**, **MM Yu**, **Miguel Sy**, **Allan Jay Quesada**, **Roy Lagarde** and **Jeoffrey Maitem**) were brought together to Tacloban – probably the city worst hit by Yolanda – for an eight-day photography fieldwork. Working once again under the wings of Veejay, Charlie and Andy, the participants produced six comprehensive photo stories which will now be presented to the Filipino public.

On Saturday, **November 8**, an interactive program featuring discussions with the photographs' subjects will take place at the **IPI Bunkhouse along Maharlika Highway in Tacloban city**. The program will start at **10:30 AM**.
