

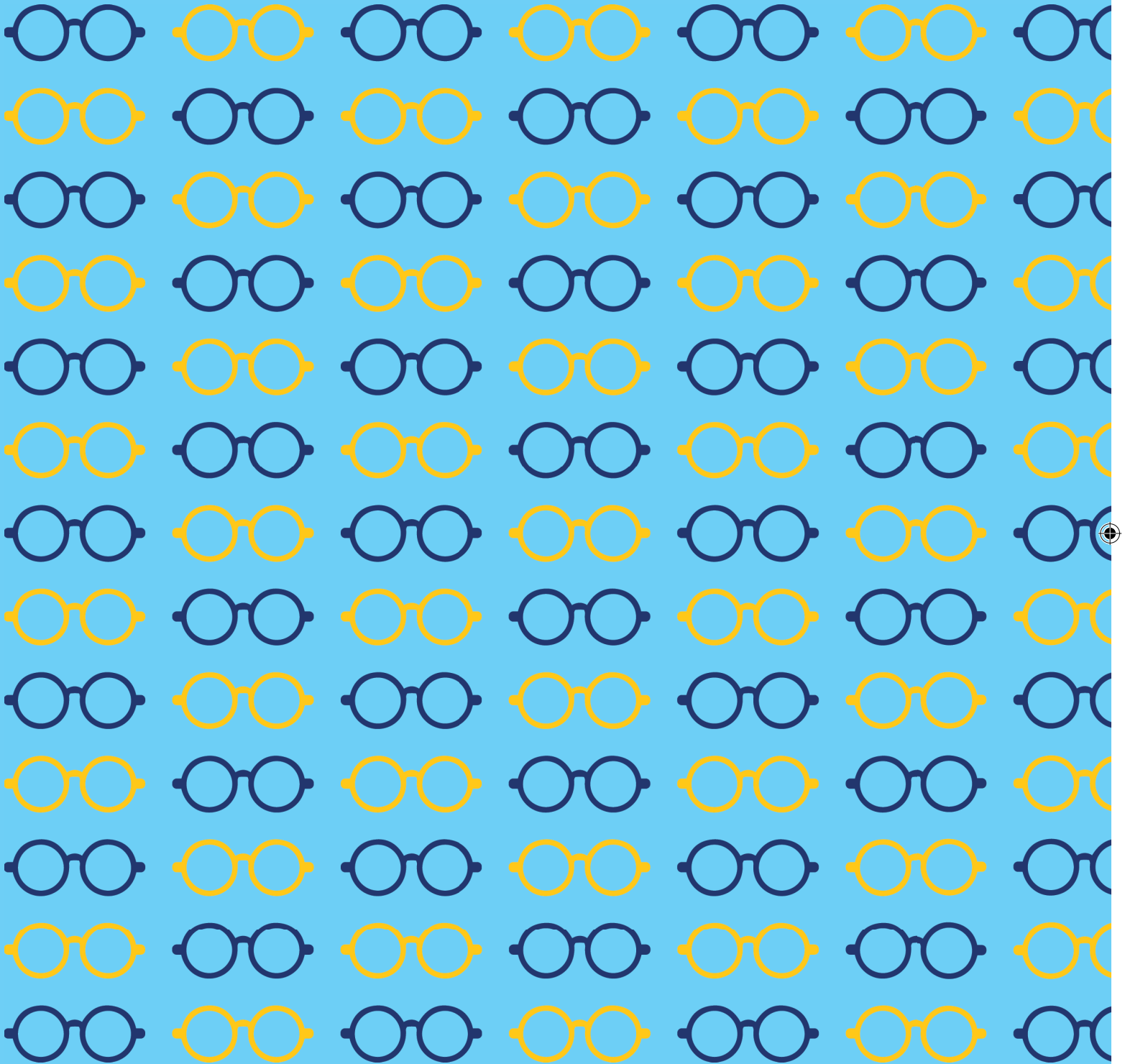


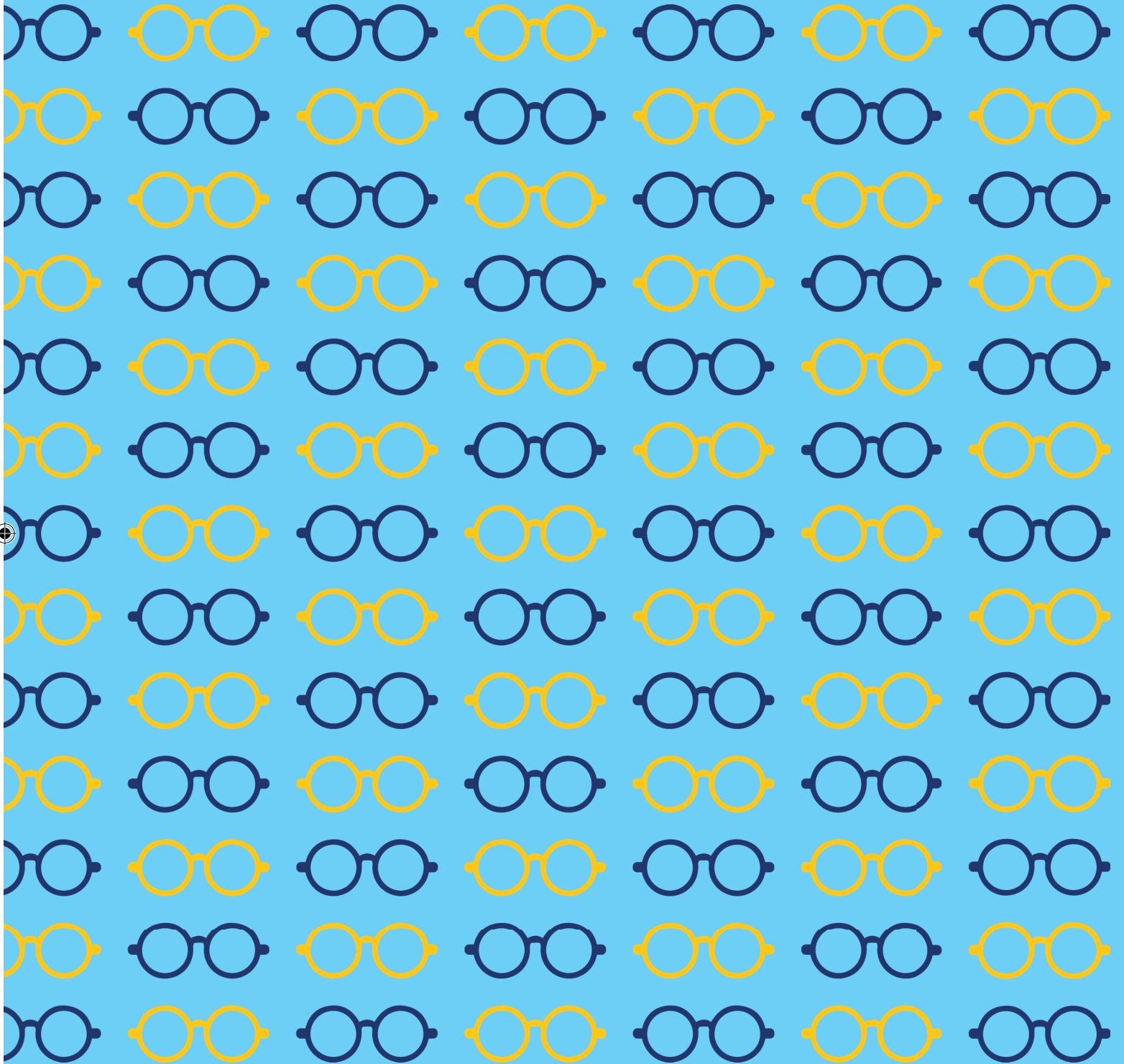

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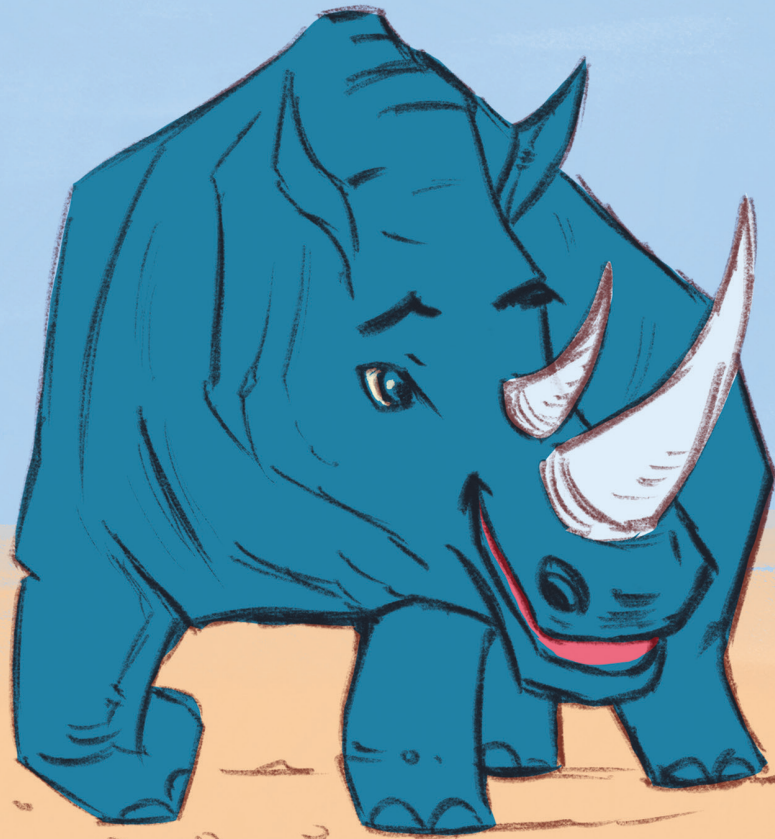

“Don’t forget to put on your glasses before you go.”

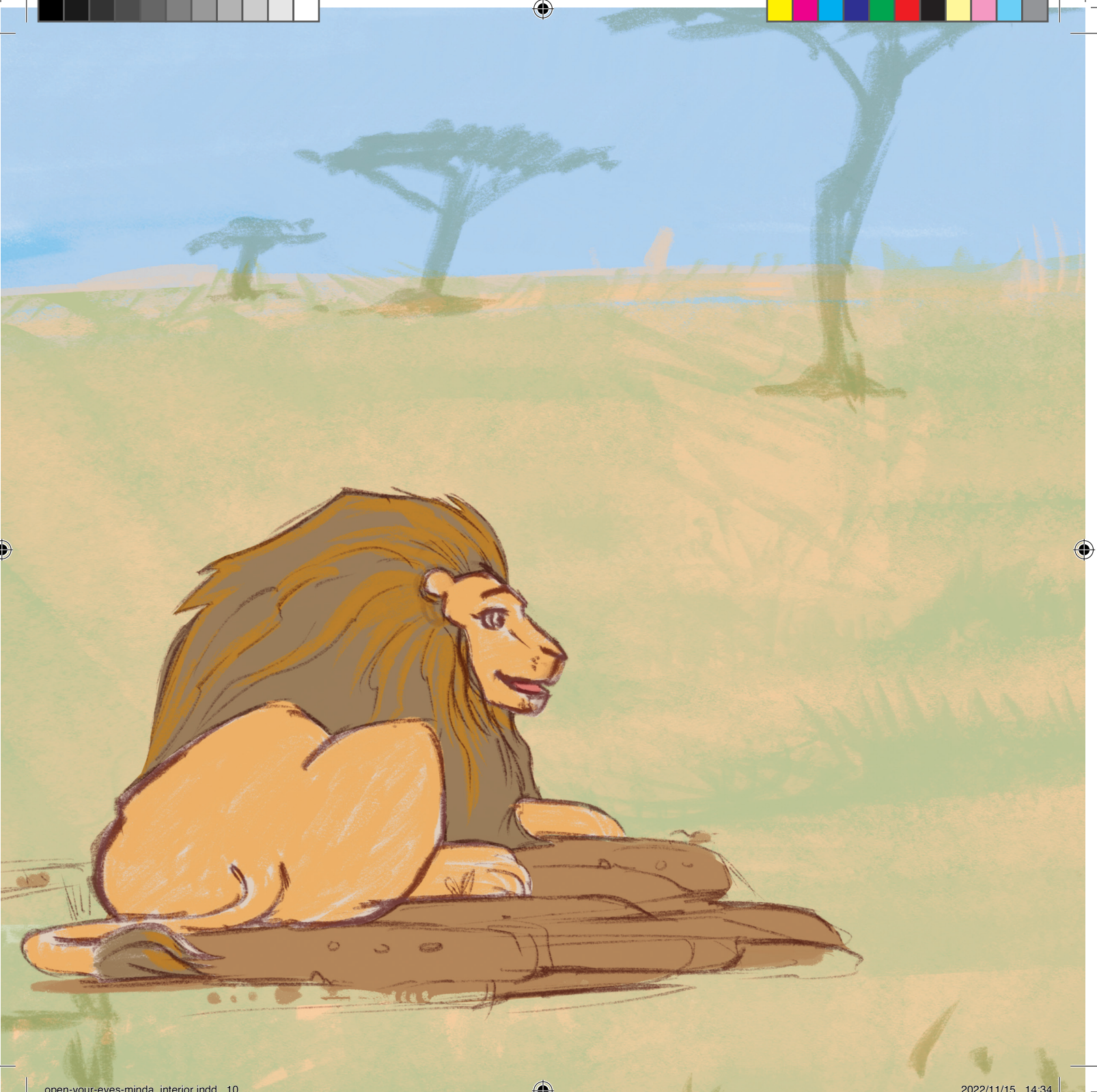


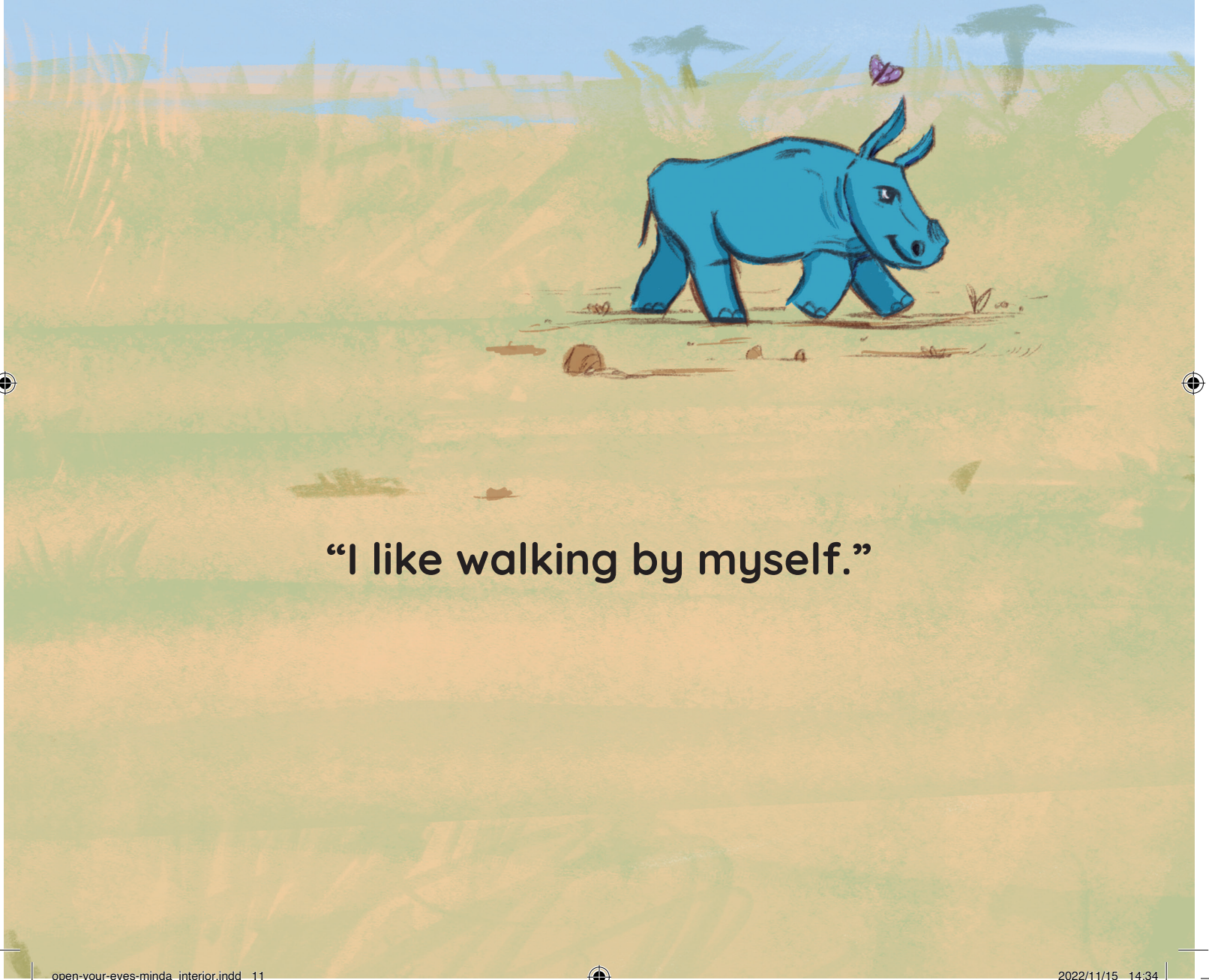




“I don’t need glasses,” Minda mumbles to herself. “I can see without them and I know my way.”







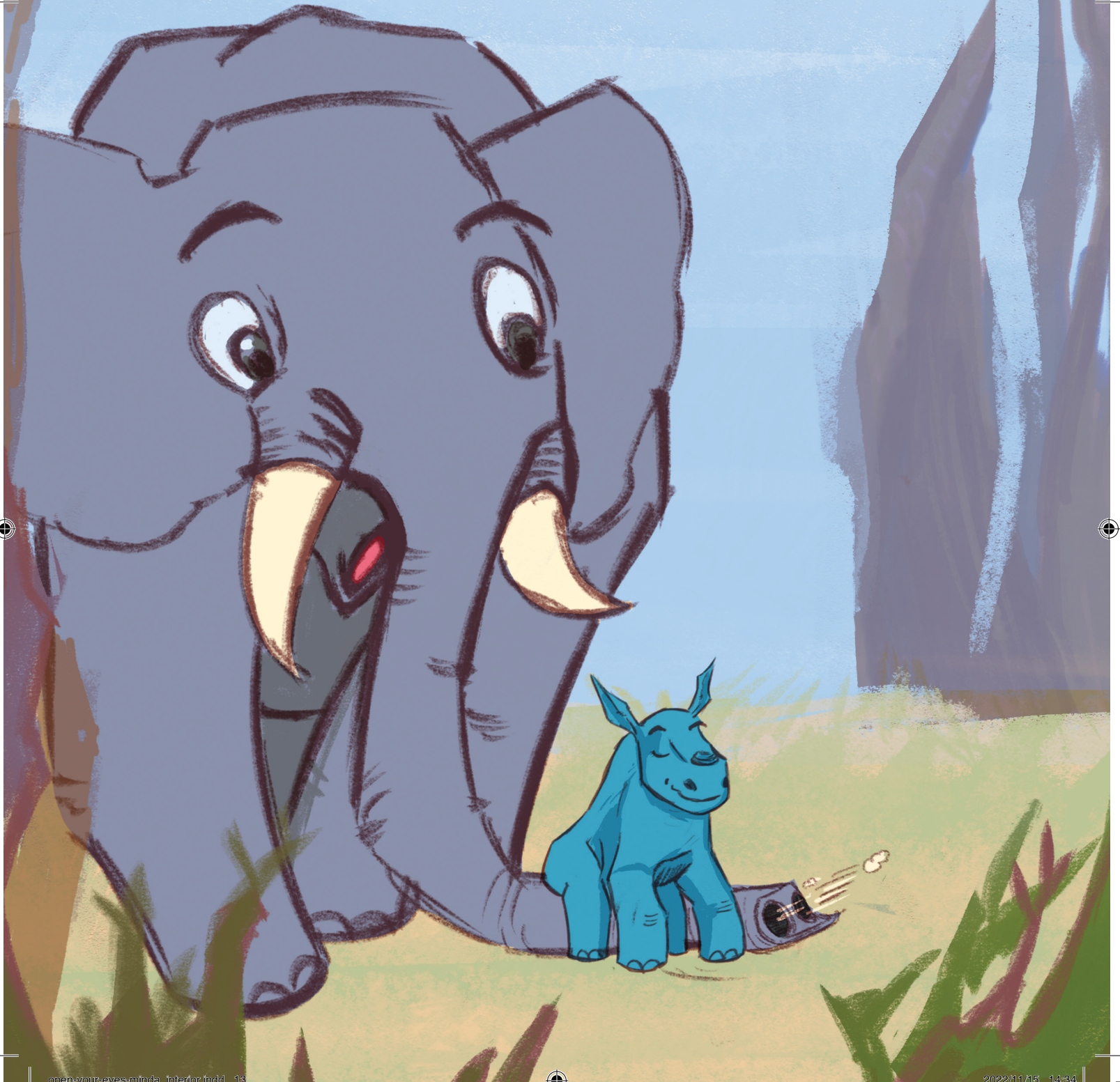
“I like walking by myself.”

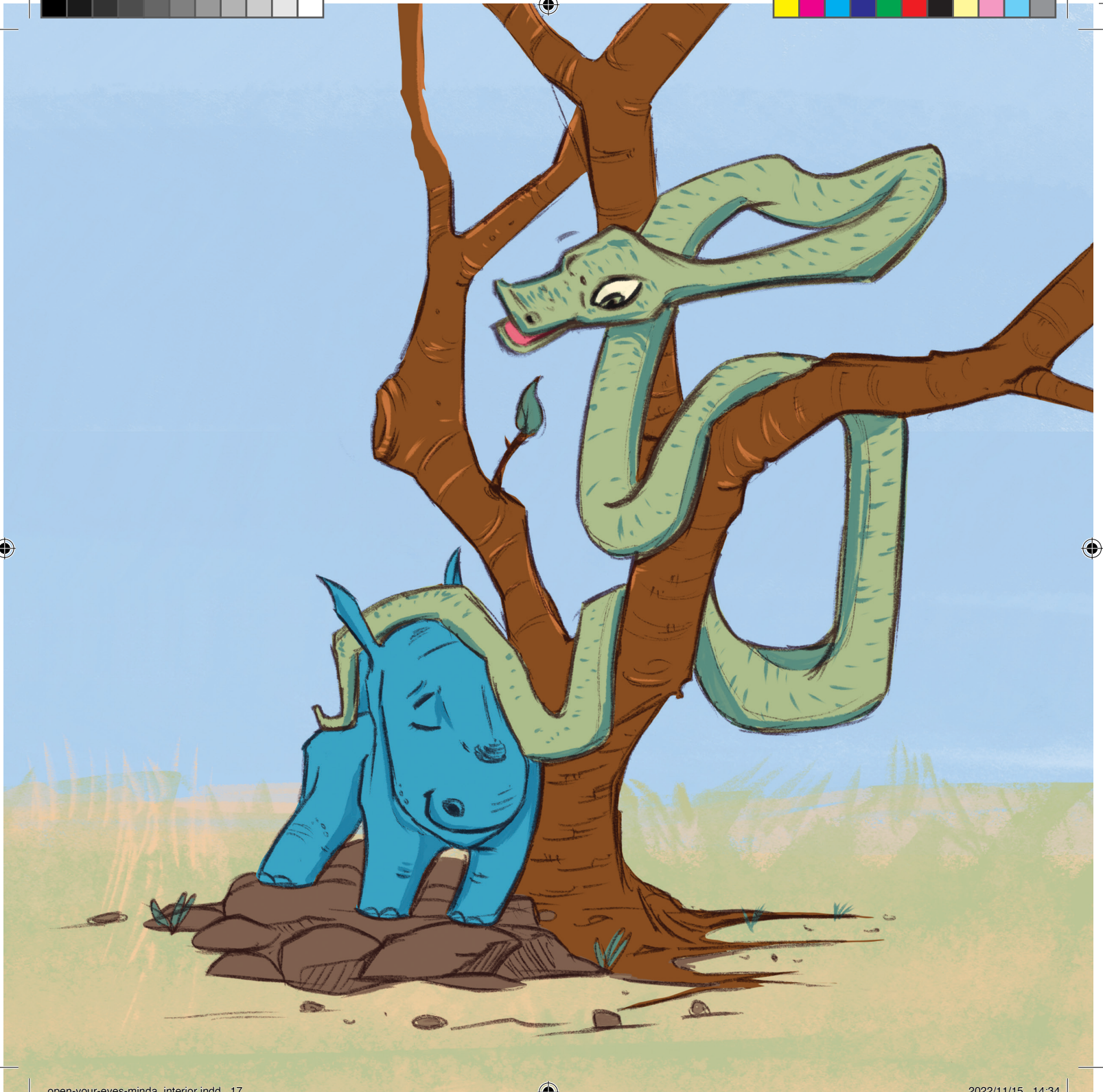

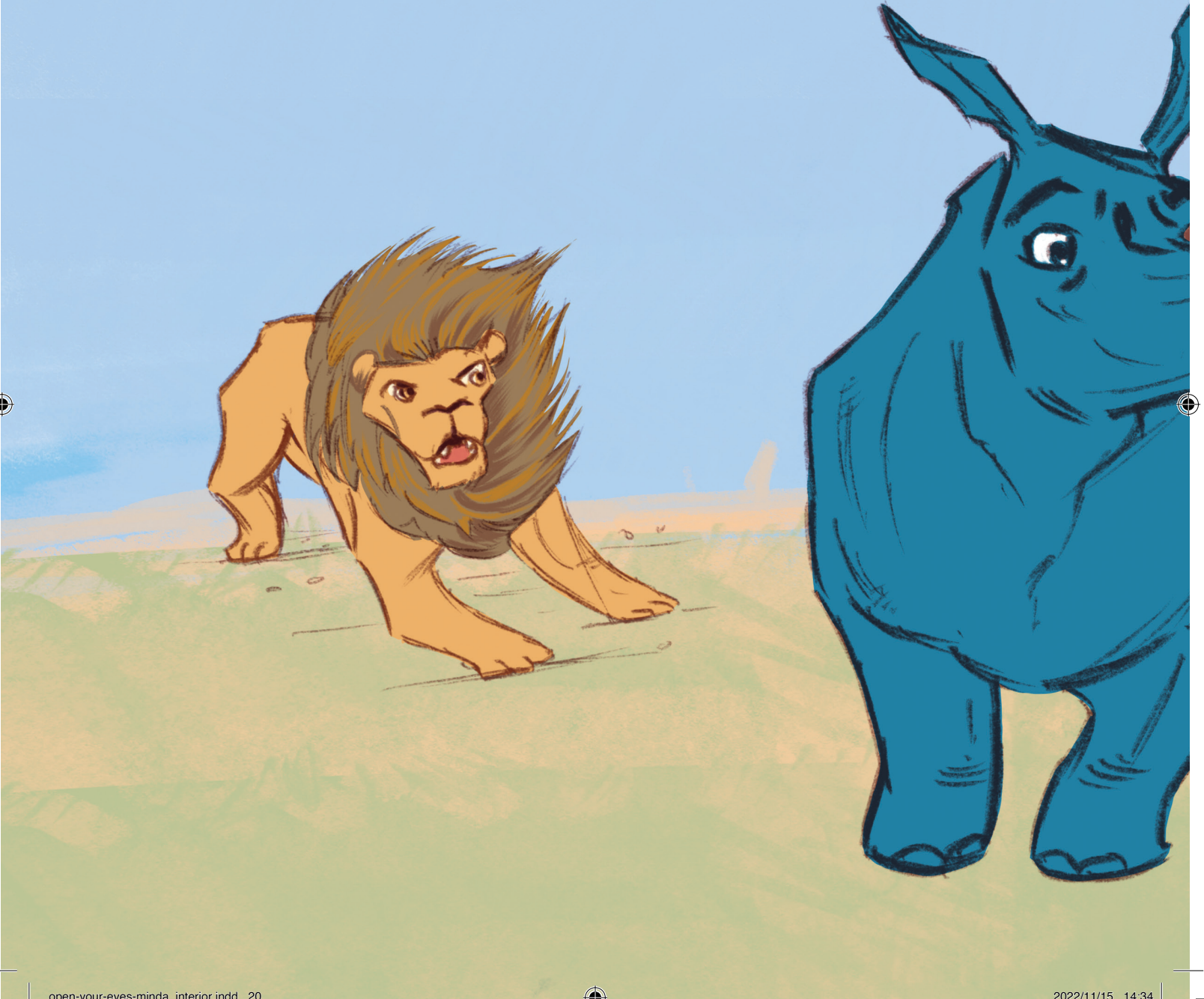
“What funny branches are these? They are sooo soft.”





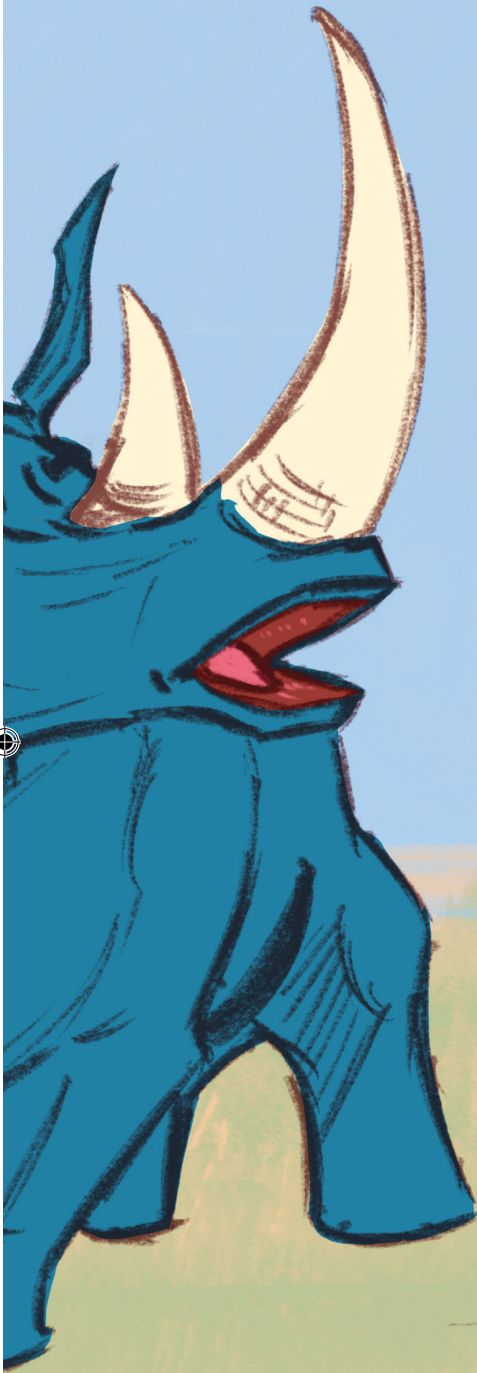


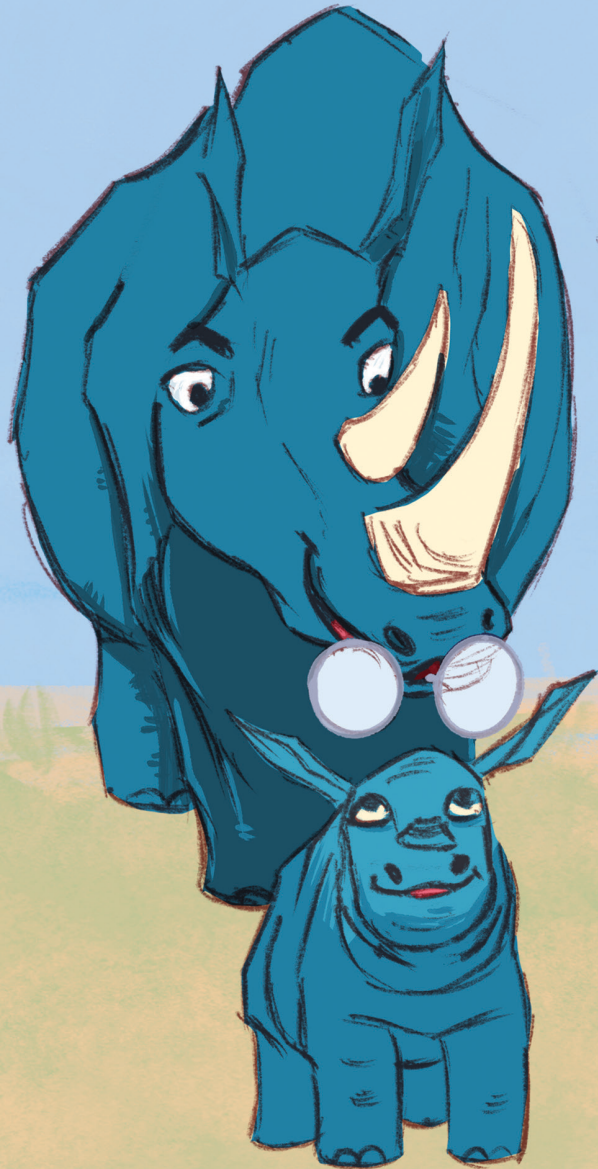






“Minda!” Mum shouts.
