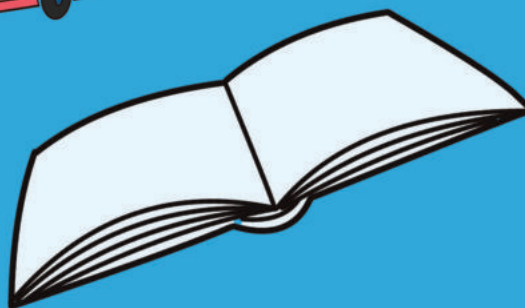
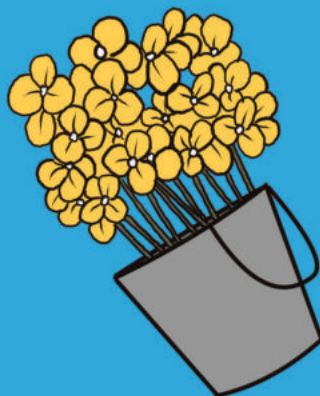
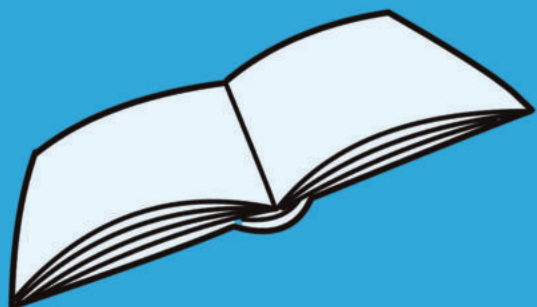

like Dad,” Elina says.









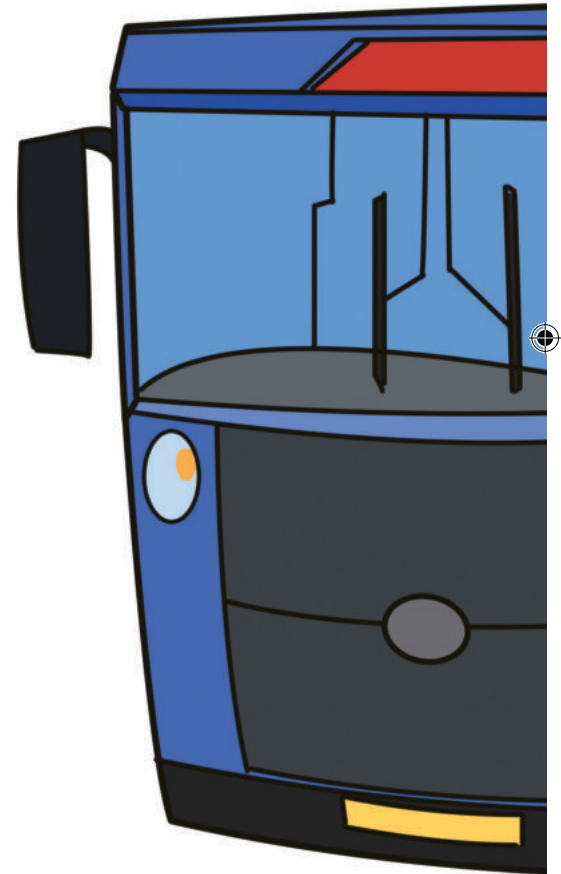


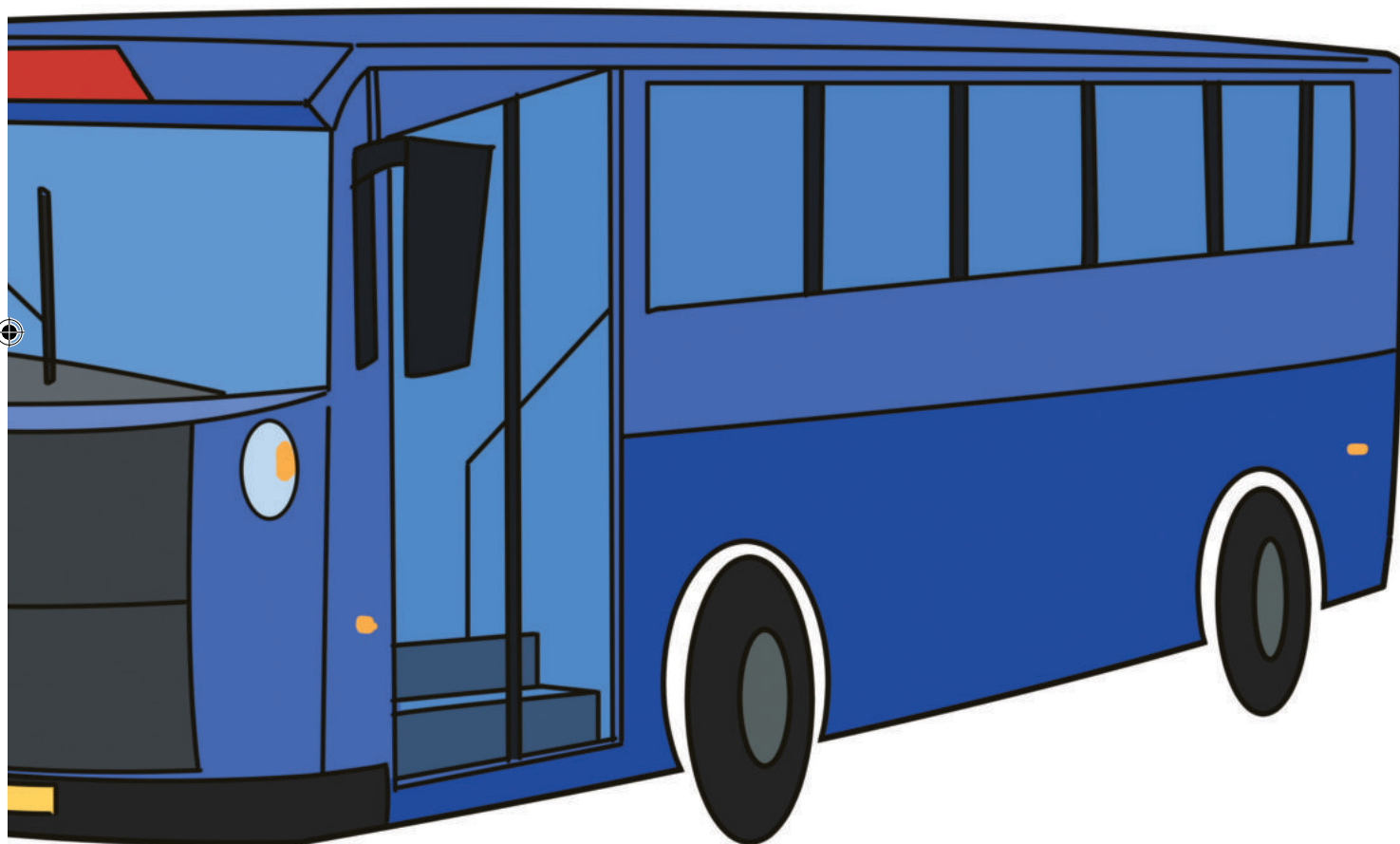
“I like flowers,” Nali says.
