

OPEN CALL: CITIZEN JOURNALIST PROGRAMME

Explore Slovakia or Portugal while tackling disinformation.

Duration: 1-week

We are looking for **emerging journalists (aged 18-30)** and **students of journalism** who are passionate about combating disinformation with a focus on **minority cultures, EU identity, urban culture & housing, environment, health,** or **wellbeing** in a transnational context.

Who Can Apply

- Journalists (18 30) with **at least 2 years of reporting experience** or a solid understanding of disinformation-related topics.
- Students of journalism who are interested in the above-mentioned topics.
- Proficiency in **English**, the working language of the program.

What We Offer

- A stipend of up to 1,900 EUR, covering travel, accommodation, and research-related expenses during a min. 1-week research stay in Slovakia or Portugal (provided as a lump sum).
- The possibility to engage in a transnational dialogue on the challenges of disinformation
- A network of European experts and journalists

Application Requirements & Process

Your digital application in English must include the following documents:

- 1. Your CV and a letter of motivation
- 2. At least one **writing sample** (made available in Slovak or Portuguese)
- 3. **Research idea/proposal for at least one larger content piece that you want to work on** during your residency make sure it has a transnational dimension. For example, you can compare a specific situation in your home country to the situation in the country where you are spending your 1-week residency
- 4. Final content piece should be published in Slovak or Portuguese language (English is optional)
- 5. **Information regarding your availability** (placements can take place between March and December 2025)
- 6. Which country do you want to visit for research (Portugal, Slovakia)
- 7. **Information about your home media** or youth media of choice where your content piece will be published
- 8. Please provide confirmation of your media of choice for the publication of the content piece
- 9. **Cost calculation** (note, that the maximum stipend amount is 1.900€)
