3 min	Whole group	The children can join in with a song	Sing Felix and Franzi out of the letterbox, with the music.  https://www.goethe.de/resources/files/mp31/ halo_felix_mastered.mp3 They bring a picture out of the box for the learners to look at.	Felix and Franzi     puppets and box	Hallo Felix, Hallo Franzi! – Hello Felix, Hello Franzi!  Guten Morgen, Guten Tag! – Good morning, good day!  Encourage children to wave to the puppets and clap along to the song. End the song with a big "Hallo"









Time	Social Form	Learning Objective	Content	Ma	aterials.	Phrases and Gestures
7 min	Whole group	The children use both German and English to interpret artwork	Artist focus: Look at the picture that Felix and Franzi have brought: What can you see? Who painted it? Where did/do they come from? How was it made? Together look at the colours in their paintings – can we name them in German? Can we point to the colours and say a whole sentence? 'Das ist' Then discuss the patterns and shapes in English. Show the learners other paintings by the same artist.	•	Examples of paintings	Welche Farbe ist das? – Which colour is that?
20 min	Small groups	The children create a piece of art	In small groups, learners could use a range of media to reproduce their own style of picture based on the styles of the artist studied.  Examples: For Paul Klee, draw round maths 2D shapes to make your own pattern. For Hundertwasser, design the front of a building, with different colour sections. For Ute Laum- use watercolours to paint sunsets  For a display, the pictures could be labelled with the German colour words. The learners present their artwork and describe the colours.	•	Media such as crayons/chalk/ pencils/pens/ pastels/paints/ magazines and glue for collage Paper Brushes etc	Wir basteln! – Let' create something together!
2 min	Whole class	The children can join in with a song	Sing Felix and Franzi back into the box. <a href="https://www.goethe.de/resources/files/mp31/goodbye-felix-mastered.mp3">https://www.goethe.de/resources/files/mp31/goodbye-felix-mastered.mp3</a>			Auf Wiedersehen Felix, auf Wiedersehen, Franzi – Goodbye Felix, goodbye Franzi. Incorporate a goodbye wave and use the ritual for putting the puppets back into the box.
