2 min	Whole group	The children can join in with the Felix and Franzi "Hello" song	Sing Felix and Franzi out of the letterbox, with the music. https://www.goethe.de/resources/files/mp31/halo_felix_mastered.mp3	 Interactive whiteboard/screen with internet access and audio Felix and Franzi letterbox Felix and Franzi puppets Christmas hats / tinsel for Felix and Franzi 	Hallo Felix, Hallo Franzi! - Hello Felix, hello Franzi! Guten Morgen - Good morning Guten Tag - Good day Wave to greet the puppets and clap to the song. End the song with a wave and a big "Hallo".
6 min	Whole group	The children can tell what they found in their St Nicholas shoe/ The children can ask Felix and Franzi what they found in their St Nicholas shoe	Felix and Franzi appear with their shoes and their gifts inside. They ask whether the children found something in their shoes, too. The children tell Felix and Franzi what was inside their shoes. The children have to guess what is in Franzi's shoe. Do the same with Felix's shoe. They revisit the vocabulary. Sing the St Nicholas song all together again: https://www.goethe.de/resources/files/mp31/UCultural 1 Nikolauslied.mp3 The children can use the lyrics sheet. Was war in Felix/Franzis Schuh? – What was inside Felix's/Franzi's shoe?
2 min	Whole group	The children learn about Christmas card traditions in Germany	Felix or Franzi should be holding a German Christmas card, decorated with Christmas pictures such as a star, candles, a snowman etc. The leader asks Felix and Franzi "Was ist das?" ("What is that?")	 Felix and Franzi puppets Christmas hats / tinsel for Felix and Franzi A Christmas card for Felix and Franzi, with German greetings 	Was ist das, Felix und Franzi? – What is that, Felix and Franzi? Hier ist eine Weihnachtskarte. – Here is a Christmas card. Heute machen wir auch Weihnachtskarten. – Today we are also making Christmas cards.

The leader encourages the children to say the words out loud while playing. As an alternative game, one child can also hold up an image and the other children in the group have to say the word. The child who says the word first receives the card. 		
5 min	Individual task	The children decorate the front of their Christmas cards	The leader tells the learners that they are now going to decorate the front of their German Christmas cards. They will write the message inside later. Note When choosing images for the front of their Christmas cards, the learners could draw these themselves, they could cut out coloured card or you could provide printed images for them to colour in. 5 min	Individual task	Learners can write greetings and salutations inside their cards in German	Tell the learners that they are now going to write a message inside their Christmas card. Use the board to provide the key language.	A4 card and materials for decorating Christmas cards	Wir schreiben die Weihnachtskarten. – Let's write the Christmas cards. Wir benutzen diese Wörter. – Let's use these words.









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			The greeting depends on the gender of the person receiving the card e.g. • Liebe – Dear + female / plural recipient • Lieber – Dear + male recipient The sign off depends on the gender of the person sending the card e.g. • Deine – From + female sender • Dein – From + male sender They can then choose any other messages from the following: • Frohe Weihnachten! – Happy Christmas! • Schöne Feiertage! – Happy holidays! • Frohes neues Jahr! – Happy New Year! • Einen guten Rutsch! – Happy New Year! (literally "a good slide") Note You could create a PPT slide / handout with this language to save time writing on the board.
