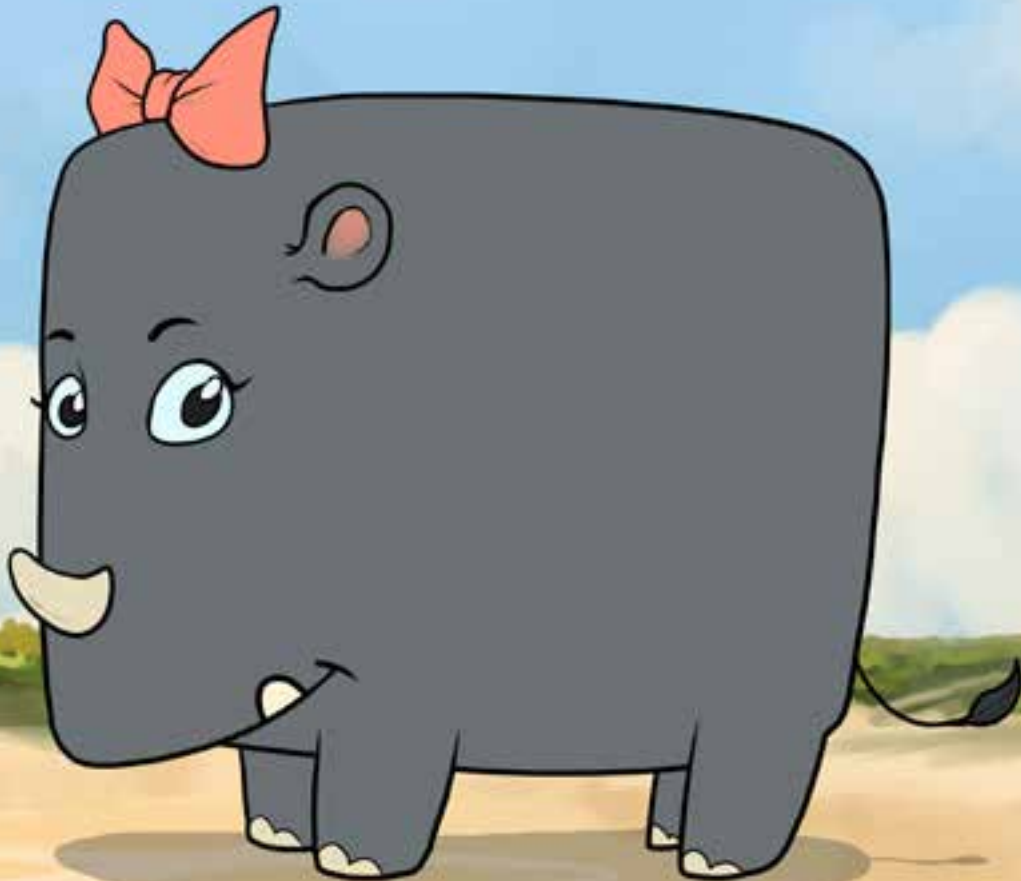

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Let's Find Mama Rhino

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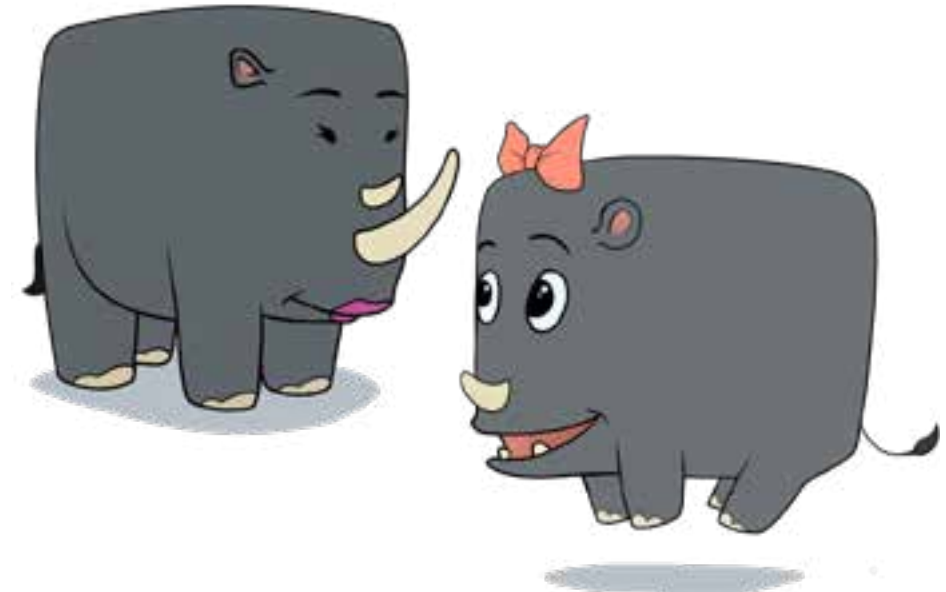
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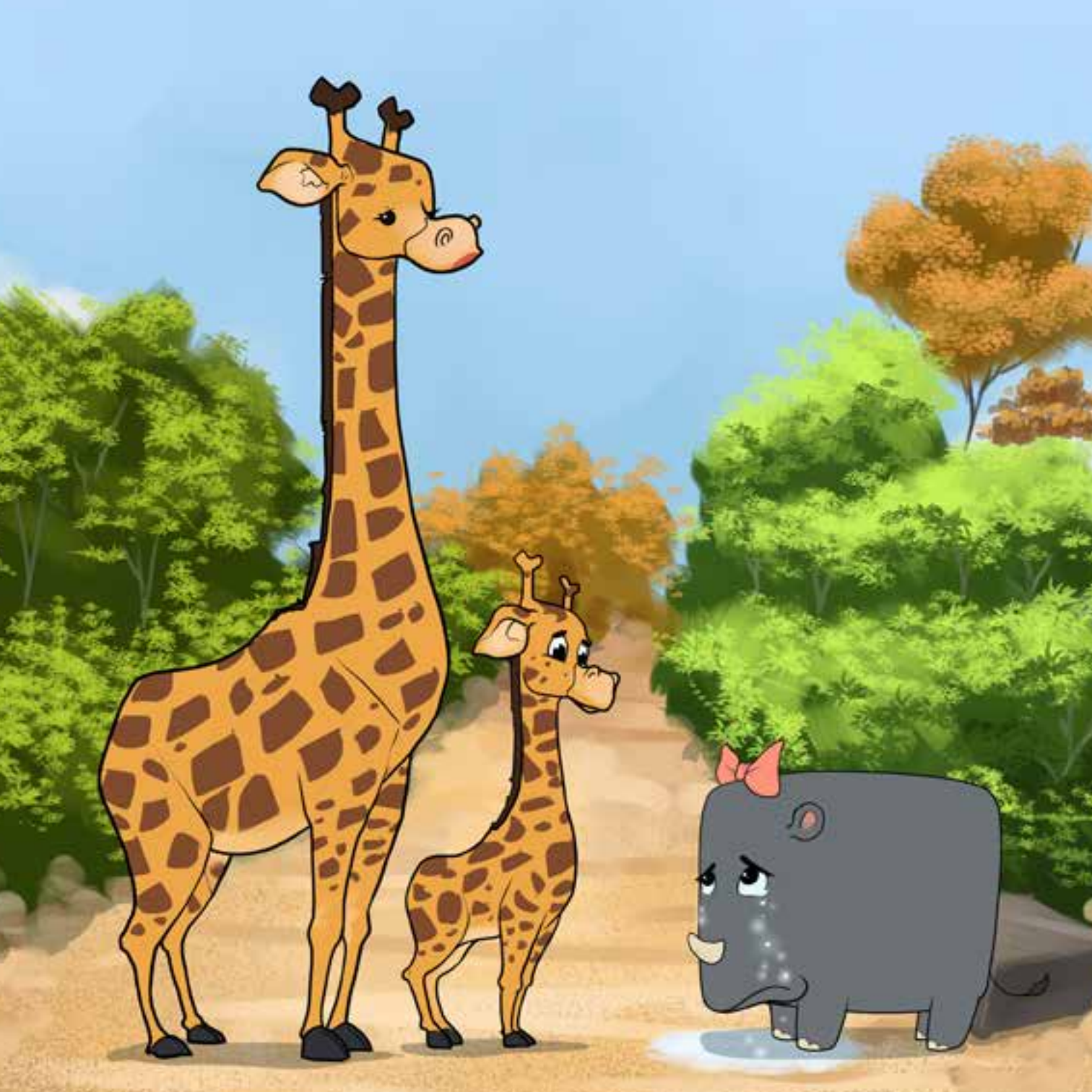

Kudu says.

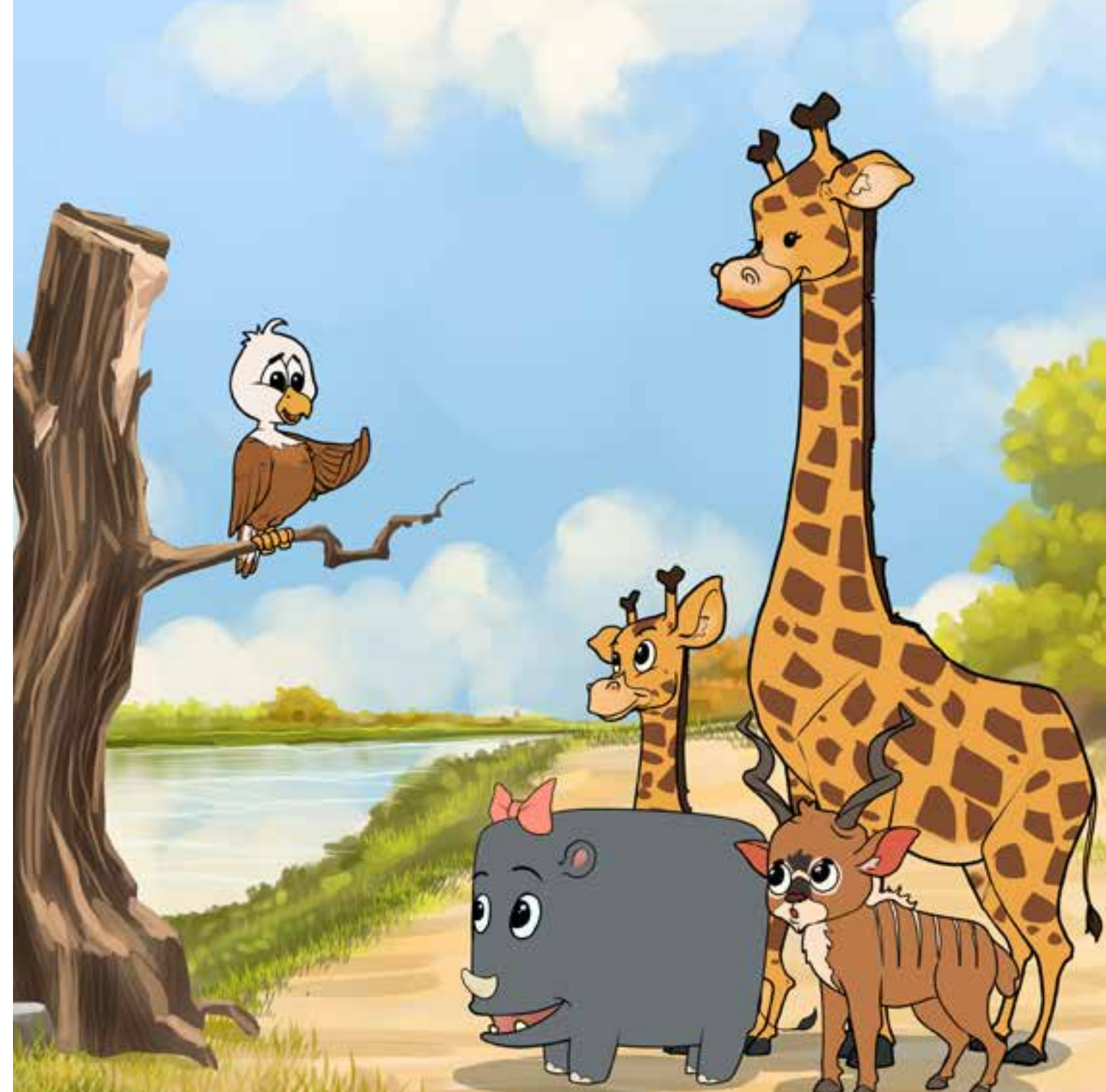
“Where are you going?”

“Get out of my cave!”





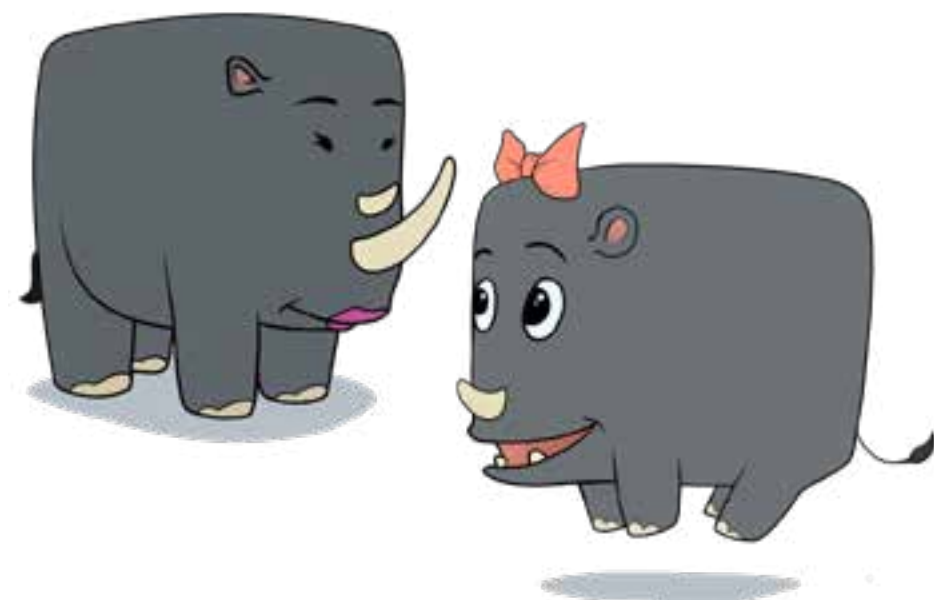
“Mama! We found you!”
