








"What is that?" She wonders and stops in front of the bush.



"Who are you? Why are you alone? Where is your mum?" asks Ndapandula.




"Look mum!

"Do you think Snowy's mum is looking for him?" asks Ndapandula.


"I'm sure," says mum.

"This is a good idea. Let us go together," says mum.




"Please Mum... can we keep Snowy?" "Who will take care of Snowy?" asked mum.
