Objective

The learners can make animal shadows with their hands and name animal in German.

2 mins	Whole group	The learners are able to greet each other in German.	Leaders and learners greet each other with German greeting words learnt in the previous session. They move around the room, greeting as many people as possible. Leaders should be addressed as "Herr XXX" or "Frau XXX" to practise using those terms.		Hallo Hello. Guten Morgen Good morning. Guten Tag Good day. Learners could shake hands when greeting each other.
10 mins	Whole group	The learners know animal names and	The leader invites the children to re-watch the video they watched previously about shadow plays and pay attention to the animals formed in the shadow theatre. 		can pronounce them correctly.	The leader introduces the German word <i>die Tiere</i> and writes it on the board. The children repeat it. The leader asks: Which shadow animals did you see in the shadow theatre? The children name the animals. The leader introduces the German words and puts word and image cards of the animals on the board (die Maus, der Tiger, der Vogel, der Hase, der Hund). The children repeat them. The instructor puts more word and image cards of animals on the board and introduces the German words (die Ziege, der Wolf, der Bär, die Gans, das Kamel). The children repeat. To practice the new vocabulary, the leader draws one animal on the board. The children guess which animal it is. The leader introduces the structure: <i>Das ist</i> and encourages the students to use this structure while guessing the next animal he/she draws. The instructor draws 4-5 animals on the board; the children guess which animals they are. Note: It is also possible for the children to draw animals on the board and for the other children to guess the animals.	Magnets Animals (Tiere) image and word cards	animals do we see in the video? 6 mins	Whole group	The learners understand how to make animal shadows with their hands.	The leader tells the learners that they are going to make their own shadow animals with their hands. Discuss: Which animal shadows do we think we could make with our hands? The leader demonstrates the dog as shown in the video at 1:56: https://kinderuni.goethe.de/mod/videoscore/view.php?id=25873	Interactive whiteboard with internet access and audio Torch or directable table lamp	Zuhören bitte Listen carefully. 10 mins	In pairs	The learners can use the German animal names to name animal shadows.	The leader tells the learners that they are going to work in pairs. Using the image cards of animals, a torch and wall / screen, the learners practice making animal shadows with their hands. The learners can also use a copy of the information sheet on how to make shadow animals: https://www.mamiweb.de/familie/handschatten/1 Partner A then makes an animal shadow with their hands. Partner B says the name of the animal in German. Then the learners swap roles. Do an example with one of the learners before they begin. Each group then presents one or two shadow animals in front of the class. The audience guesses which animals are presented to them by using the structure Das ist (der Hund, die Maus)	 Torch or directable table lamp – one per pair Animals (Tiere) image and word cards Information sheet: https://www.mamiweb.de/familie/handschatten/1 	Wir arbeiten in Paaren Let's work in pairs. 2 mins	Whole group	The learners can say goodbye in German.	The leader recaps what the learners have achieved in the session and congratulates them on their work. The leader encourages the children to repeat the German words from the lesson. Each child then fills out "My word bank sheet: Shadow Play (Schattenspiele)" for this lecture and writes down the German words and chunks they learned in today's lesson. The learners leave the session saying goodbye in German.	"My word bank sheet: Shadow Play (Schattenspiele)"	Toll gemacht Well done! The learners take part in the club's goodbye ritual.
