Note on the Processing of Personal Data in accordance with Articles 13 and 14 of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)

1. Purpose and Legal basis for processing the data

The Goethe-Institut carries out projects within the framework of the national AMIF funding guidelines. As part of project organization and coordination (e.g. when registering for events), the Goethe-Institut processes personal data of target group members. Furthermore, the Goethe-Institut is obliged to report on personal data in the course of managing and accounting for AMIF grants. The legal basis for processing is Article 6 Paragraph 1 b) and 1 f) GDPR. The Goethe-Institut will contact the participants by email for the purpose of evaluating the project measures and providing information about other project offerings. The legal basis is Article 6 Paragraph 1 f) GDPR.

2. Type of data stored

The following data are gathered for people in the target group:

Surname, First name, Date of birth, Gender, Country of origin, Nationality, Type of identification document with number and issuer, Planned place of residence in Germany, Reason for residence in Germany, Email Address

3. Retention and Deletion of Data

The project documents are kept or stored for a period of 10 years starting on December 31 of the year in which the project ends (§ 31 AMIF funding guidelines). After this period has expired, deletion generally takes place.

4. Rights to Data Protection

Upon request, each “data subject” has the following rights regarding the processed personal data if the relevant requirements are met:

- Information about processing (Art. 15 GDPR)
- Correction of incorrect data (Art. 16 GDPR)
- Deletion of data that is no longer required (Art. 17 GDPR)
- Restriction of processing (Art. 18 GDPR)
- Objection to processing (Art. 21 GDPR).

Contradiction: You can have your data processed on the legal basis of Art. 6 Para. 1 f) GDPR at any time for reasons arising from your particular situation contradict.

We will then no longer process your data unless we can demonstrate overriding compelling legitimate reasons for the processing or the processing serves to assert, exercise or defend legal claims.

The following applies to data processing based on consent in accordance with Art. 6 Para. 1 a) GDPR: Right to withdraw consent.

Should you have given your consent to the processing of your personal data when concluding the contract, you can still revoke your consent at any time in the future. This does not affect the lawfulness of data processing carried out based on consent until its revocation.
