Kamera Kwanza: Dahomey by Mati Diop

Dahomey, which won the Golden Bear at the 2024 Berlinale, concerns a different sort of time travel. Set in November 2021, the film follows the repatriation of Kingdom of Dahomey treasures from a museum in Paris to their original home in present-day Benin. But rather than simply document the process, Diop subtly and creatively dramatizes the journey. Playful but sharply conceived, Dahomey quietly forges a self-reflexive dialectic around notions of cultural and cinematic inheritance—ideas that animate the whole of Diop's practice, yet here take on a historical resonance only suggested in her prior work.




