Purpose

To introduce participants to storytelling as an advocacy tool in order to provide individuals with a voice, a safe space to express and discuss their personal testimonies, the injustices they have been subjected to. To introduce participants to the idea of holding safe spaces for the people they work with. To explore with participants the ways in which they can document personal testimonies sensitively. And to explore how such testimonies can be effectively used within legal justice activism.

The 3-day workshop will introduce participants to the storytelling and story documentation model used by The BuSSy Project, a method to provide survivors with a voice, a safe space to express and discuss their personal testimonies, the injustices they have been subjected to. This type of storytelling aims to remove the shame and stigma attached to the stories and the storytellers, and allow the storytellers to go through an empowering healing experience by sharing their stories with others. The workshop will also look at how these stories can be used sensitively and impactfully for advocacy.

Participants will explore methods of creating and holding safe spaces, for the women and men they work with, for sharing of personal stories, the documentation process with respect to personal testimonies, including, formulating ethical guidelines, carrying out risk assessments and dealing with survivors. And how these stories can be communicated to the public via different media, such as, on stage, written word.

BuSSy is a performing arts project that documents and gives voice to censored untold stories about gender in different communities in Egypt.
