Choose a protest topic the group can agree on.

It could be a serious world issue such as war, poverty, global warming, or another global topic; it could also be a more personal issue like protesting homework, the driving age, your school dress code, etc. List your ideas and choose one.

Try your topic out in Chat GPT by typing in: "Write a protest song about . . ." and read the results.

Try more versions of your question to get different results.

For example, you could be more specific: "Write a rap protest song with two verses from the point of view of a German student who wants to lower the driving age."

Try several different versions with your group and examine the results. Record the questions you type into Chat GPT here.

Next, modify and/or combine some of Chat GPT's lyrics with your own ideas. Make it more personal by adding names, places, etc. Consider adding a few German words. **Your final song should include at least four verses with a minimum of four lines in each verse and at least five significant changes to the Chat GPT version.**

Write the final version of your group's song into the left box. Into the right box, please write the original ChatGPT version.

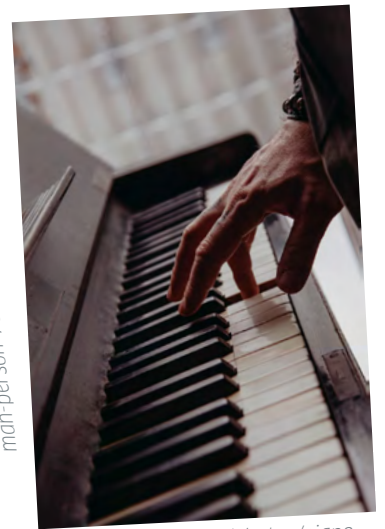
